<u>Issue 1</u>: What categories of operating costs should be subject to the index?

Recommendation: All operation and maintenance expenses should be indexed with the exception of:

- a) Pass-through items pursuant to Section 367.081(4)(b);
- b) Any amortization of rate case expense; and
- c) Disallowances or adjustments made in an applicant's most recent rate proceeding.

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Issue 2: Which index should be used to determine price level adjustments? Recommendation: The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) Implicit Price Deflator Index is recommended for use in calculating price level adjustments. Staff recommends calculating the 1998 price index by using a fiscal year, four-quarter comparison of the GDP Implicit Price Deflator Index ending with the third quarter 1997.

Issue 3: What should the 1998 Price Index for water and wastewater utilities be?
Recommendation: The 1998 Price Index for water and wastewater utilities should be 2.10%.

Issue 4: How should the utilities calculate and provide annualized revenues for indexing purposes?

Recommendation: The Commission should continue utilizing the present format presented as Appendix "B" to staff's 1/8/98 memorandum.

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Issue 5: How should the utilities be informed of the indexing requirements?

Recommendation: The Division of Records and Reporting should be directed to mail each regulated water and wastewater utility a copy of the PAA order establishing the index which will contain the information presented in Appendix "C" of staff's memorandum. A cover letter (Attachment 1 of staff's memorandum) from the Director of the Water and Wastewater Division should accompany the Order.

Issue 6: How many copies of the index and/or pass-through application should be filed?

Recommendation: Six (6) copies of the index and/or pass-through application should be filed directly with the Division of Water and Wastewater.

Issue 7: Should the Commission require that any protest to the Notice of Proposed Agency Action in this docket be filed with the Commission within fourteen days of issuance of that notice?

Recommendation: Yes. The Commission should require that any protest to the Notice of Proposed Agency Action (PAA Order) in this docket be filed with the Commission within fourteen days of issuance of the PAA Order. Furthermore, the PAA Order should provide notice that any party filing the protest should be required to file their prefiled, direct testimony along with their protest.

14-day protest period after issuance of the Commission Order.
