and Docket No. 980007-EI, environmental cost recovery

clause.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances, starting with you, Mr. Palecki.

7	MR. SCHIEFELBEIN: Page 1, the first
8	appearance.
9	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Corporation. Got you.
10	MR. SCHIEFELBEIN: Thank you.
11	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Any changes
12	through Page 5 and down to the end of basic positions
13	on Page 6? Okay.
14	MR. KEATING: I believe this is directed to
15	Peoples Gas counsel. I believe they filed an amended
16	prehearing statement, and that perhaps some of the
17	numbers in its basic position on Page 6
18	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Wait a minute, that's
19	Mr. Nicholson.
20	MR. NICHOLSON: I just moved down.
21	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. Some
22	changes to basic positions?
23	MR. KEATING: Yes. I believe that
24	MR. NICHOLSON: Actually believe on Issue 1
25	on Page 7, those numbers are the corrected numbers.

The 3,911,759 with the notation that that figure includes West Florida's 103,000 underrecovery. 3 MR. NICHOLSON: I was referring to their Statement of Basis Position that's on Page 6. I don't 5 think that some of the numbers in that statement of basic position reflect the numbers from their amended 7 prehearing statement. I think they are reflected in each of the individual issues and positions after that 8 point. 9 10 MR. NICHOLSON: That is correct. So those should be changed and we'll stipulate that they be in 11 12 agreement with the later issues. COMMISSIONER CLARK: The basic positions, 13 14 the numbers in the basic position will be changed to conform with what is in the numbered issues. All 15 right. Issue 1. OPC. 16 17 MR. HOWE: Public Counsel will take no position on all issues. 18 19 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. 20 MR. KEATING: Staff finds that the positions 21 taken by all of the parties are reasonable and, 22 therefore, accepts those positions. 23 COMMISSIONER CLARK: On Issue 1. 24 MR. KEATING: On Issue 1.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Show it as a proposed

stipulated issue. Issue 2.

MR. KEATING: Staff would like to add at the end of its position on Issue 2 a sentence that reads "Peoples estimated true-up amount includes \$23,492 overrecovery associated with West Florida Natural Gas."

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Mr. Nicholson.

MR. NICHOLSON: That's correct. And also, I guess, on Issue 2, does that mean we take out on Staff's position the \$23,000 for West Florida?

MR. KEATING: Yes, that's correct. We would eliminate the bottom line on the table.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. With those corrections we show Issue 2 as a proposed stipulated issue. Okay. Issue 3.

MR. PALECKI: Commissioner Clark, on Issue 3
City Gas would add the word "underrecovery" after the
number on Page 8 to agree with Staff's position. We
just omitted the word "underrecovery" in our
prehearing statement.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. With that change, is there agreement on this issue?

MR. KEATING: I believe Staff would like to make a change to its position on this issue. Again, we would delete the last line in the column for West

Florida Natural Gas, and add a sentence to the note below our position, that since -- it would read 2 3 "Peoples projected true-up amount includes \$80,177 underrecovery associated with West Florida Natural Gas." 5 6 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. With that change 7 we'll show it as a proposed stipulated issue. Issue 8 No. 4. 9 MR. KEATING: Staff agrees with the 10 positions of the parties and would accept those as reasonable. 11 12 COMMISSIONER CLARK: You would show the same 13 change with respect to West -- you already show it as 14 merged. Okay. We'll show that as a proposed 15 stipulated issue. Issue 5. 16 MR. KEATING: I believe that Issue 5 can 17 also be shown as a proposed stipulation. 18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Issue 6. 19 MR. SCHIEFELBEIN: Chesapeake, CUC, would 20 take no position on Issue 6. 21 MR. NICHOLSON: As would Peoples Gas. 22 COMMISSIONER CLARK: That should be taken up in the generic proceeding, so it should be eliminated 23

as an issue. Is there anything else we need to take

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up with 03?

As I understand it all of the issues are stipulated, therefore, the witnesses don't have to be here. We will stipulate the witnesses' testimony and evidence in the record, and, again, ask Staff to let each Commissioner know -- you don't need to let me know -- but Commissioner Garcia and Commissioner Jacobs, that unless they request it, the witnesses will not be here because those are all -- the docket involves all proposed stipulated issues. Anything else? Thank you very much. The prehearing is adjourned. (Thereupon, the hearing concluded at 3:30 p.m.)
