7	started, I'd like to note that Staff has supplied a

10	Prehearing Order was first issued last Thursday.

20	have a proposed stipulation on Issue 1.		
21	MS. PAUGH: Should we here from OPC and by		
22	FIPUG first?		
23	MS. KAUPMAN: On Issues 1 through 4 FIPUG		
24	has no position.		
25	MR. HOWE: Public Counsel will take no		

1	position on all issues except No. 15, where we will
2	agree with Staff.
3	MS. PAUGH: With respect to Issue 1, Staff
4	finds the position taken by TECO to be reasonable and,
5	therefore, accepts the same.
6	COMMISSIONER CLARK: All right. We'll show
7	Issue 1 as a proposed stipulation. Issue 2.
8	MS. PAUGH: The same is true with respect to
9	had you Issue 2.
10	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 3.
11	MS. PAUGH: Staff finds the position taken
12	by TECO to be reasonable and, therefore, it accepts
13	the same.
14	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Show it as a proposed
15	stipulation. Issue 4.
16	MS. PAUGH: Issue 4 is still being resolved.
17	MR. BEASLEY: Tampa Electric will agree with
18	the Staff's number there in the little supplement you
19	referred to, \$2,748,383. We agree with Staff on that
20	number.
21	MS. PAUGH: Thank you.
22	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Show Issue 4 as
23	proposed stipulation. Issue 5.
24	MS. KAUFMAN: FIPUG agrees with Staff.
25	MS. PAUGH: Staff finds the position taken

1	by TECO to be reasonable and, therefore, accepts the
2	same.
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll show that as a
4	proposed stipulation. Issue 6.
5	MS. KAUPMAN: FIPUG has no position.
6	MS. PAUGH: Staff finds that the position
7	taken by the company is reasonable and, therefore,
8	agrees to same and withdraws Staff's language.
9	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 7.
10	MS. KAUFMAN: Up through Issue 14 FIPUG has
11	no position.
12	MS. PAUGH: Staff finds the position of TECO
13	to be reasonable with respect to Issue 7 if TECO will
14	agree to our language.
15	MR. BEASLEY: I think I will, subject to
16	check, I'll do that and confirm.
17	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. We'll show it as
18	a proposed stipulation, subject to check.
19	MS. PAUGH: With respect to Issue 8, I have
20	a question of counsel.
21	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Go ahead and finish up,
22	Mr. Beasley, then we'll go to 8.
23	MS. PAUGH: Issue 8 your categories RS and
24	RST, did you mean for that number to be something
25	other than .333?

1	MR. BEASLEY: Yes, that should be 0.033.
2	MS. PAUGH: We will show that correction.
3	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Can we show a proposed
4	stipulation?

9	Company to be reasonable and can agree to it if the

13	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 10.
14	MS. PAUGH: Same is true with respect to
15	Issue 10, if the Company agrees with our language we
16	agree with their position as reasonable.
17	MR. BEASLEY: Issue 10. Yes. We agree with
18	that. And we can revisit 7 and stipulate with the
19	Staff on that as well.
20	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Thank you.
21	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 11.
22	MS. PAUGH: If the Company will agree with
23	our language, we agree with their position as
24	reasonable.

1	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 12.
2	MS. PAUGH: If the Company will agree to our
3	language, we can agree that their position is
4	reasonable.
5	MR. BEASLEY: Stipulated.
6	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 13.
7	MS. PAUGH: The same is true with respect to
8	Issue 13.
9	MR. BEASLEY: We agree.
10	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Issue 14.
11	MS. PAUGH: If the Company will agree to our
12	language, we can find their position to be reasonable.
13	MS. KAUFMAN: We have no position.
14	MR. BEASLEY: We will stipulate as well.
15	COMMISSIONER CLARK: Proposed stipulation on
16	14. Issue 15.
17	MS. PAUGH: I'm sorry, Commissioner, I have
18	been advised that the figure in Staff's language in
19	Issue 14 that says 160,249 should be changed to
20	160,429; apparently those numbers were transposed. We
21	apologize.
22	MR. BEASLEY: Sounds reasonable.
23	COMMISSIONER CLARK: We did Issue 15. Issue
24	16.
25	MS. KAUFMAN: Excuse me, I'm sorry. Did we

do Issue 15? If we did I missed it. We agree with 2 Staff, FIPUG does, on Issue 15. 3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. MS. PAUGH: Staff finds the position of the 4 5 Company to be reasonable if they will agree to our 6 language. 7 MR. BEASLEY: We will. 8 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Show that as a proposed 9 stipulation. Issue 16. 10 MS. PAUGH: This is the annualization issue. Staff's position is that it should be spun out into a 11 separate docket. 12 13 COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll show that in a -spun out into the separate docket and to be handled as 14 15 expeditiously as possible. 16 MS. PAUGH: Thank you, Commissioner. 17 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. Thank you. 18 We're done with 01 and 07, so for those of you who aren't here on 02 and 03, you may be excused. 19 20 MS. PAUGH: Just a reminder to the parties 21 in the 01 docket that we do need to meet right after 22 this prehearing. 23 MR. STOME: Commissioner, may we clarify that the witnesses in 07 have been excused? 24 25 COMMISSIONER CLARK: It's all proposed

stipulations; is that right? All right. We'll indicate that they will be excused from appearing, but we will stipulate the evidence and testimony into the record. MR. STONE: Thank you. COMMISSIONER CLARK: I always wonder what happens if some Commissioner says no, they don't agree with the stipulation, what we'll do. MR. STONE: Let's hope we never find out. COMMISSIONER CLARK: Well, I guess what we need to do is let the two other Commissioners know that these things have been stipulated, and unless they want a witness there, they will not be there. Okay?
