PROCEEDINGS 1 (Mearing convened at 9:30 a.m.) 2 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Cail the prehearing to 3 order. Read the notice. MR. COX: Pursuant to notice filed February 5 27th, 1998, this time and place have been set for a prehearing conference in 971314-TP, complaint of 7 Sprint Communications Limited Partnership doing business ar Sprint and Sprint Metropolitan Network, Inc. against BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. 10 regarding breach of Interconnection Agreement. 11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: We'll take appearances. 12 MS. WEITE: Nancy White for BellSouth. 13 MR. BOYD: Everett Boyd for Sprint. And let 14 me also enter an appearance for Benjamin Fincher of 15 Sprint's Atlanta office, also for Sprint. MR. COX: Will Cox and John Bowman on behalf 17 of the Commission Staff. 18 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Are there any 19 preliminary matters I have to take up, Mr. Cox? 20 MR. COX: Staff has a couple. 21 First, on the first page we just wanted to 22 indicate that John Bowman will also be appearing on 23 behalf of Commission Staff. That was inadvertently 24

left out.

COMMISSIONER CLARK: And you indicate 1 Benjamin --2 MR. BOYD: Fincher. 3 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Will appear -- he'll be 4 here for the hearing, if there is one, right? 5 MR. BOYD: Yes, indeed, if there is one. 6 MR. COX: We do have one motion, which is a 7 Motion to Substitute Witness by BellSouth. As far as 8 Staff is aware there are no objections from the 9 parties. 10 MR. BOYD: We have no objection. 11 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Okay. We'll show then 12 that -- how do we -- is it on the Prehearing Order? 13 MR. COX: Two primary places. One is on 14 Page 4 in the Order of Witnesses. Okay. And the 15 other place is in the Exhibits, Page 12 through 13. 16 COMMISSIONER CLARK: Do we just 17 substitute -- is it Mr. Stacy? 18 MR. COX: Mr. Stacy for Mr. Moore's. 19 adopting Mr. Moore's testimony. 20 COMMISSIONER CLARK: And the Prehearing 21 Order will indicate that he's adopting Mr. Moore's 22 testimony. 23 MR. COX: Yes, it will. It will indicate in 24

Back early last year the parties had some discussions and they came to an agreement that from March 21st, was kind of a cutoff day in their relationship, so I want to make clear that our complaint is only based on events that have occurred from that date forward, in terms like a cause of action. And our prayer for relief is only based upon the events that have occurred since March 21st, 1997. And I believe we have, in our Complaint, had the material allegations only in that time period. Now, at the same time in the testimony, from a historical standpoint, just to sort of set the stage, there are some references back to prior to that date. But we want to make it clear that our prayer for relief and our claims are only based on the events that occurred

from March 21, 1997, forward.
