

MANAGERIAL CAPABILITY OF SOUTHNET TELECOMM SERVICES, INC.

TECHNICAL QUALIFICATIONS/MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE

The Company has assembled a highly skilled management team, which brings a wealth of experience and expertise to the Company's local telecommunications services venture. Together, the Company's executives provide it with the depth and breadth of management, operational and technical capabilities necessary to facilitate its provision of high quality, affordable local exchange telecommunications services.

Brief summaries of the experience of key members of the Company's executive team and independent consultants are set forth below:

RONALD F. ANDEREGG Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer

Ronald F. Anderegg, Chairman of the Board of SouthNet, possesses extensive managerial experience, having been responsible in his latest corporate position for generating over \$230 million in annual sales, and for the oversight of 2,500 employees, in 76 locations in 19 states East of the Mississippi. Mr. Anderegg has successfully implemented large-scale business plans and marketing strategies, grown start-up enterprises into substantial consumer service businesses, and effectively managed corporate growth.

TECHNICAL CAPABILITY OF SOUTHNET TELECOMM SERVICES, INC.

As set forth in Attachment C hereto (incorporated by reference), Applicant's senior management team possess significant experience in many aspects of telecommunications service provision. The Commission has previously granted SouthNet authority to provide interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of Florida. SouthNet respectfully submits that the Company also possesses the technical capability to provide high quality local telecommunications services within and throughout the State of Florida. SouthNet has operated as a provider of interexchange telecommunications services since the Company's inception in 1995, making available to consumers an integrated offering of interexchange, cellular and paging services and consistently maintaining an elevated level of service integrity. In conjunction with the provision of such service, SouthNet has developed a management team well-versed in addressing the service needs and concerns of its customer base. As the Company has expanded its provision of services to encompass the interexchange and more recently the local telephone service arenas, the management team has likewise been expanded to include members whose experience in the provision of local and interexchange service enriches the Company's ability to address the telecommunications needs of its business and residential customers.

SouthNet believes its proposed service offering, which will be set forth more fully in Applicant's Price List, would significantly advance the public interest by enhancing the local telecommunications service options available to the as-yet significantly underserved residential telecommunications market.¹ Coupled with Applicant's long-standing commitment to providing examplary customer service, the broadening of SouthNet's current service offering to include local telecommunications services will benefit residential consumers by allowing them to enjoy the benefits of "one-stop" shopping for the satisfaction of all their telecommunications needs.

SouthNet will provide its local telecommunications offering to residential and small business users in a manner designed to satisfy both the heightened customer service expectations and the price-sensitivity of these customers. To the extent that Applicant's activities enhance competition, consumers should benefit from lower prices, increased network efficiencies and perhaps even higher quality and innovative telecommunications services.

SouthNet will fully comply with the rules and regulations of this Commission in connection with the provision of local telecommunications services. In particular, recognizing the critical role local telecommunications service plays in enabling consumers to immediately contact emergency service providers, Applicant will provide the same level of access to 911 that local exchange carriers currently provide in their respective service areas. SouthNet will collect a 911 fee from subscribers and remit such fees to the appropriate 911 jurisdiction in accordance with Section 365.171, Florida Statutes.
