BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, provides that a person may not acquire ownership or control of any telecommunications facility, or any extension thereof for the purpose of providing telecommunications services to the public, including the acquisition, transfer, or assignment of majority organizational control or controlling stock ownership, without prior approval from this Commission.

By letter dated June 14, 1999, Gulf Coast Services, Inc. (Gulf Coast Services), Gulf Long Distance, Inc. (Gulf Long Distance), Gulftel Communications (Gulftel), Gulf Telephone Company d/b/a Gulf Payphone Enterprises (Gulf Payphone), and Madison River Telephone Company (Madison River Telephone) filed with this Commission an application for approval of transfer of control of Gulf Coast Services, and its subsidiaries, Gulf Long Distance, Gulftel, and Gulf Payphone to Madison River Telephone. Gulf Long Distance is the holder of Interexchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 3493. Gulftel is the holder of Alternative Local Exchange Telecommunications Certificate No. 5254. Gulf Payphone is the holder of Pay Telephone Certificate No. 5582. The companies have stated that the transaction will be virtually transparent to their customers in Florida and it will not affect the services being provided. The companies further stated in their petition that they will continue to operate under their existing certificated names and tariffs on file with this Commission.

In accordance with our authority under Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, to approve the acquisition or transfer of majority organizational control or controlling stock ownership of a telecommunications company providing service in Florida, we have reviewed the Petition of Gulf Coast Services, Gulf Long Distance, Gulftel, Gulf Payphone, and Madison River Telephone, and find it appropriate to approve it. We have based our review and decision upon an analysis of the public's interest in efficient, reliable telecommunications service. Our decision does not address the potential impact of the transfer on the competitive market in Florida, or on the companies' or their competitors' interests. We emphasize, however, that our approval of the Petition pursuant to our authority under Section 364.33, Florida Statutes, does not preclude us from addressing any of our concerns that may arise regarding this transaction to the appropriate federal or state agencies.

Based on the foregoing, it is,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Gulf Coast Services, Inc., Gulf Long Distance, Inc., Gulftel Communications, Gulf Telephone Company d/b/a Gulf Payphone Enterprises, and Madison River Telephone Company's request for approval of transfer of control of Gulf Coast Services, Inc., and its subsidiaries, Gulf Long Distance, Inc., Gulftel Communications, and Gulf Telephone Company d/b/a Gulf Payphone Enterprises to Madison River Telephone Company is hereby approved.
