Issue 1: Should the Commission impose a \$500 fine or cancel the pay telephone certificates issued to the companies listed on page 4 of staff's November 18, 1999 memorandum for apparent violation of Rule 25-24.520, Florida Administrative Code, Reporting Requirements?

Recommendation: Yes. The Commission should impose a \$500 fine or cancel each company's respective certificate listed on page 4 if the information required by Rule 25-24.520, F.A.C., Reporting Requirements, and fine are not received by the Commission within five business days after issuance of the Consummating Order. The fine should be paid to the Florida Public
