Dear Mr. Van Leuven,

It is evident that you are concerned about my description of the disposition of the U.S. Mail that I sent to the PSC (postmarked 3/31/00). As you so pointedly noted, I did use the word "apparently". It is not my intention to be condescending or pedantic, however, you should note that according to the latest Merriam-Webster Collegiate Dictionary, "apparently" is defined as:

Manifest to the senses or mind as real or true on the basis of evidence that may or may not be factually valid.

In my telephone conversation with yourself and Jennifer Brubaker (May 17,2000) we discussed the fact that the U.S. Mail that I sent to the PSC was not received. Whether it was not delivered by the Post Office, or misdirected by the PSC mailroom, or misplaced by a PSC employee, the fact remains that *six weeks* after I sent this mail neither you nor Jennifer Brubaker was in possession of the U.S.Mail. In view of this fact, my liberal characterization of "apparently misplaced" seems almost too generous.

If you feel that I maligned or misquoted you...I apologize. What or who is responsible is of no concern to myself and the residents of Pine Lakes Country Club. What is of the utmost importance is...will the Commissioners and/or Attorneys assigned to Docket 000277-WS recognize my right to participate in these proceedings, along with the representative of 281 Estate owned homes (Leon Beekman-President Pine Lakes Estates Home Owners Association, Inc.

Since my *timely* E-mail of March 31, 2000 has been *acknowledged* by an internal E-mail to you, from Jennifer Brubaker, and copied to me on 5/9/00, I expect there will be no reasonable argument to "electronically discriminate" and disenfranchise myself and my neighbors. Hopefully the PSC will reconsider their archaic 'U.S.Mail' only policy and enter the cyberworld as so many state and federal governmental agencies have already done.
