Dear Ms. Bayo:

Pursuant to the Commission’s July 31, 2007 Order in the above-referenced docket, Qwest Communications Corporation (“QCC”) hereby notifies the Commission

that the internal corporate restructuring of QCC and OnFiber Carrier Services, Inc.

(“OnFiber”) was consummated on October 31, 2007 (“Restructuring”). The

Restructuring merged OnFiber, its immediate corporate parent and its affiliates with and

into QCC, with QCC emerging as the surviving entity.

The Commission approved the Restructuring and the request for waiver of the

carrier selection requirements of Rule 24-4.118, Florida Administrative Code, for the

transfer of customers served pursuant to each certificate / registration, but emphasized

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that cancellation of the CLEC certificate and IXC registration may be handled administratively.¹ Accordingly, QCC and OnFiber with this letter cancel the aforementioned certificate and registration, without prejudice. If any further action or information is required to accomplish these efforts, please contact me at your earliest convenience.

As required by the rules, QCC and OnFiber provide the following information:

- (a) QCC intends to pay any unpaid Florida regulatory assessment fees for OnFiber, including any associated penalties and interest, within thirty (30) days after closing the restructuring transaction.
- (b) OnFiber proposes to cancel Certificate No. 7521 and its IXC registration in Florida, because the restructuring transaction described in the Application will result in the ultimate merger of OnFiber and its direct parent corporation with and into QCC, with QCC emerging as the surviving corporation. QCC's Florida ALEC certificate and IXC registration permit the provision of the same telecommunications services to OnFiber's customers as currently provided under OnFiber's Certificate No. 7521 and IXC registration.
- (c) Since QCC is the surviving corporation, all customer deposits made by customers to OnFiber that have not been returned will be transferred to QCC. No final bills will be rendered as a result of this restructuring transaction.
- (d) Since QCC will continue to provide telecommunications services to OnFiber's customers in Florida, no discontinuance of service is associated with this cancellation and it is unnecessary to provide any individual customer notice regarding discontinuance of service.

QCC and OnFiber also seek Commission consent to withdraw OnFiber's state tariffs upon cancellation of the CLEC Certificate and IXC Registration. QCC's existing tariffs can already accommodate, to the extent necessary and appropriate, the provision of service under the same rates, terms, and conditions as those in the OnFiber tariff(s).
