PETITION ON PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION

The Citizens of the State of Florida (“Citizens”) by and through their undersigned attorney, pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes, and Rules 25-22.029 and 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, file this objection to the Florida Public Service Commission’s (“Commission”) Order No. PSC-08-0309-PAA-WU (“Order”), issued May 13, 2008, and state:

1. The name and address of the agency affected and the agency’s file number:

2. The Citizens include the customers of Orangeland Water Supply (“Orangeland”, “Utility”, or “Company”) whose substantial interests will be affected by the Order because the Order authorizes the Utility to increase the rates and charges it imposes upon its customers.
3. Pursuant to Section 350.0611, Florida Statutes, the Citizens’ who file this petition are represented by the Office of Public Counsel (“Citizens”,

4. The Citizens received a copy of the Order by inter-office courier on May 14, 2008.
5. At this time the ultimate facts alleged, including the specific facts which the Citizens contend warrant reversal or modification of the agency’s proposed action are as follows:

Utility’s Attempt to Address Customer Satisfaction

a. The Citizens protest the allegations made in the Order that the customers did not have an issue with a possible 800 percent increase in their water cost. To the contrary, the customers are very concerned with the extent of the increase and particularly the portion of the increase caused by the repression adjustment proposed in the Order.

Repression Adjustment

b. The Citizens protest all of the language in the Order with regard to the repression adjustment and protest all of the repression adjustments made to the revenue requirement and rates determined by the Commission to be appropriate in this case. Specifically, the Order incorrectly estimates that under the particular facts of this case the average residential monthly consumption per customer connection of about 6,600 gallons will be reduced by more than half as a result of imposing the pre-

repression rates on the Orangeland customers. Staff has determined the pre-repression rates to be a \$14.86 base facility charge (5/8" x 3/4" meter), a \$1.92 per 1,000 gallons for the first 5,000 gallons and \$2.40 per 1,000 gallons for over 5,000 gallons. The Commission's estimate that residential water will be reduced by 53% per year is erroneous. This erroneous estimate of repressed consumption that might result from imposing the above pre-repression rates on the Orangeland customers causes an extraordinary increase to become an exorbitant increase. Applying the above erroneous repression adjustment provided in the Order produces post-repression rates with a \$14.36 base facility charge (5/8" x 3/4" meter), \$ 4.29 per 1,000 gallons for the first 5,000 gallons and \$5.36 per 1,000 gallons over 5,000 gallons. For example, a customer who uses 6,000 gallons per month, the post-repression bill would be over 50% higher than the pre-repression bill. The Citizens protest the repression adjustment and the post-repression rates provided in the Order as a result of applying the repression adjustment.

6. The foregoing matters involve disputed issues of material fact.
7. Order No. PSC-08-0309 PAA-WU establishes June 3, 2008, as the date by which protests must be filed.

8. Section 367.081, Florida Statutes, is a specific statute the Citizens contend requires reversal of the agency's proposed action.


9. The Citizens seek the Commission to take the following action with respect to the agency's proposed action:
 - a. Do not apply any repression adjustment in this case until after the customers have paid for one full year of water service utilizing the pre-repression rates.

 - b. After one full year of billing data has been collected using the pre-repression rates, the Commission's Staff should file a recommendation with the Commission concerning any adjustment that should be made to the pre-repression rates in order to give the Company an opportunity to collect the Staff estimated post-repression revenue requirement that is equivalent to the pre-repression revenue requirement provided in the Order.

 - c. This docket should remain open in order to accomplish the above repression true-up, after collection of one year of actual pre-repression billing information.

WHEREFORE, the Citizens hereby protest and object to Commission Order No. PSC-08-0309-PAA-WU as provided above, and petitions the Commission to conduct a formal evidentiary hearing, under the provisions of Section 120.57 (1), Florida Statutes, and further petitions that such hearing be scheduled at a convenient time within or as close as practical to the Utility's certificated service area.


