FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

NOW, BEFORE THIS COMMISSION, through undersigned counsel, comes Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") and, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006 of the Florida Administrative Code and section 366.093 of the Florida Statutes, hereby requests confidential classification of certain material provided to the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") staff ("Staff") pursuant to Staff's request. In support of its request, FPL states as follows:

1. On May 14, 2008, FPL provided a confidential document to Staff at its request, along with a Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), Florida Administrative Code, FPL is filing this Request for Confidential Classification to maintain continued confidential handling of that document.

2. The following exhibits are included and made a part of this request:

a. The confidential document was previously provided with the Notice of Intent filed on May 14, 2008. That confidential document is included herein by reference as "Exhibit A."

b. Exhibit B consists of an edited version of the document for which FPL seeks confidential treatment. All information for which FPL requests confidential treatment has been redacted in Exhibit B.

c. Exhibit C is a table containing a line-by-line and page-by-page identification of the information for which confidential treatment is sought and, with regard to each

d. Exhibit D includes the affidavit of C. Dennis Brandt.

3. FPL submits that the information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. To the best of FPL's knowledge, that information has not been publicly disclosed. Pursuant to section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

4. As the affidavit included in Exhibit D indicates, the information provided by FPL includes contractual terms, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of FPL to contract for goods or services in the future on favorable terms, to the detriment of FPL and its customers. Such information is protected by section 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. Additionally, FPL has an obligation to the contractual counter party not to disclose this information to the public.

5. Upon a finding by the Commission that the material in Exhibit A for which FPL seeks confidential treatment is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of section 366.093(3) such information should not be declassified for a period of at least eighteen (18) months. Additionally, the material provided should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business, pursuant to section 366.093(4).

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WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.




