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1	PROCEEDINGS	
2	CHAIRMAN CARTER: We are now Commissioners,	
3	I'm not going to entertain any questions about nutrition	
4	until we get through the next two cases.	
5	Staff, get prepared for Item 14. (Pause.)	
6	Staff, you're recognized.	
7	MS. KUMMER: Commissioners, Connie Kummer with	
8	staff.	
9	You may note that staff had requested that Items	
10	14, 15, and 16 be held sequentially. We felt that they	
11	were connected and involve the same concept. Item 16 has	
12	already been approved, and I think it may be more	
13	efficient to provide a single overview of the remaining	
14	two items since they are very similar.	
15	CHAIRMAN CARTER: I like the way you think,	
16	Connie.	
17	MS. KUMMER: As part of the rulemaking docket	
18	addressing storm hardening that became effective in	
19	February of 2007, the Commission required utilities to	
20	include operating costs and benefits, including avoided	
21	storm restoration costs, when calculating the CIAC charged	
22	for the installation of underground facilities. These	
23	dockets before you today propose modifications of tariffs	
24	to include those new elements.	
25	Docket 070231 addresses the differential for new	
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construction, while Docket 080244 addresses conversions
 which are constructed by the utility. In both dockets,
 FPL started with the old differential calculations, which
 was essentially just the upfront construction costs, and
 then added factors to account for the operating costs.

6 The operating cost adjustments were calculated 7 by using historical booked O&M costs and adding a calculated avoided storm restoration element, and that 8 calculation was consistent with what the Commission 9 10 approved in the government adjustment factor, or the GAF 11 tariff. The costs and benefits were projected over a 30-year period and discounted back to arrive at a net 12 13 present value for calculating the proposed charges.

14One significant component of FPL's differential 15 is the inclusion of lost pole attachment revenues. Since these revenues in a rate case offset the revenue 16 17 requirements used to set rates for all customers, staff 18 believes that it is appropriate to include this cost in 19 calculating underground differential. And we can proceed with more detailed discussions of each document, but I 20 21 understand that both the utility and we have several 22 intervenors here who may wish to address the Commission on these points. 23

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Let's do this. Commissioners,
I'm going to identify the parties and then come back to

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1	the bench, but I want to remind everyone that we are		
2	dealing with both Items 14 and 15. So when you make your		
3	comments, please comment on both of those.		
4	Mr. Butler, you're recognized.		
5	MR. BUTLER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. John		
6	Butler appearing on behalf of Florida Power and Light		
7	Company. Tom Coke of FPL is also here with me if you have		
8	any technical questions that you need answered.		
9	We support staff's recommendation. I think this		
10	is the right way to go to hopefully move this forward to		
11	an ultimate resolution as quickly as possible and get the		
12	rule implemented with respect to reflecting the		
13	operational cost differential in these two undergrounding		
14	tariffs.		
15	Thank you.		
16	CHAIRMAN CARTER: Thank you.		
17	Mr. Wright.		
18	MR. WRIGHT: Thank you, Mr. Chairman,		
19	Commissioners. Schef Wright on behalf of the Municipal		
20	Underground Utilities Consortium and the City of Coconut		
21	Creek, Florida, an intervenor in one of two dockets.		
22	We have no objection to the staff's primary		
23	recommendation that these tariffs be allowed to go into		
24	effect. We agree with Mr. Butler that this is the		
25	appropriate procedural mechanism to keep us moving toward		
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an ultimate resolution of all the undergrounding issues,
 including these and the other issues relating to overhead
 type costs in Docket 080522.

I did want to let you all know that we still 4 have differences of professional opinion regarding certain 5 6 calculations and methodologies of applying the 7 differentials that are in the tariffs, and accordingly we will be protesting these and setting them for hearing. 8 We do intend -- and I have conferred with my colleague, 9 Mr. Butler, about this. We do intend to get us hopefully 10 in the not too distant future to an omnibus hearing on all 11 remaining outstanding undergrounding issues so that we can 12 get them all resolved once and for all and go forward 13 knowing what exactly the rules are. 14 15 So, we have no objection to the tariffs going into effect, I just wanted to let you know where we are on 16 17 this. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 18 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Thank you, Mr. Wright. 19 20 You're recognized. 21 MR. TUCKER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I am 22 David Tucker. I am here on behalf of the City of South 23 Daytona, another intervenor in this matter. 24 In the interest of brevity, we concur with Mr. Wright. 25 We reserve our right to protest your decision.

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1	And although I could say more, I won't. Our rights are				
2	reserved, and thank you for your time.				
3	CHAIRMAN CARTER: Brilliant. Thank you so				
4	kindly.				
5	Commissioners, we have heard from staff and we				
6	have heard from the parties. Any questions, or				
7	discussion, or debate? Obviously, Mr. Wright and the City				
8	of Daytona are well within their rights to say they don't				
9	have any issue with where we are today, but they reserve				
10	their right to protest to try to bring this whole thing				
11	into one omnibus perspective, because we have had some				
12	undergrounding down in southeast Florida, some up in				
13	northwest Florida, and then I guess it does make sense				
14	that there will be a common language spoken by all the				
15	people as we deal with the undergrounding issues.				
16	So with that, Commissioners, any questions as it				
17	relates to Item 14 or Item 15? Hearing none. The chair				
18	is now open for a motion on Item 14.				
19	Commissioner McMurrian, you're recognized.				
20	COMMISSIONER MCMURRIAN: I move the staff				
21	recommendation on Item 14.				
22	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Second.				
23	CHAIRMAN CARTER: Moved and properly seconded.				
24	Any questions, any discussion, any debate, or any comment?				
25	Hearing none. All those in favor, let it be known by the				
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sign of aye. 1 2 (Simultaneous aye.) CHAIRMAN CARTER: All those opposed, like sign. 3 4 Commissioner Edgar, on Item 15, you're 5 recognized. 6 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I make a motion in favor of 7 the staff recommendation. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Second. 8 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Moved and properly seconded. 9 Any questions, any debate, any comments on Item 10 15? Hearing none.
