1 PROCEEDINGS 2 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Good afternoon. I'd like to call 3 this prehearing to order. Commissioner Skop presiding. 4 And if staff could please read the notice. MS. KLANCKE: By notice issued by the Commission 5 6 Clerk, this time and place has been set for a prehearing in 7 Docket Number 080318-GU. 8 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. 9 Could we please take appearances. 10 MR. WATSON: May it please the Commissioner. 11 Ansley Watson, Jr. of Macfarlane, Ferguson, and McMullen, P.O. 12 Box 1531, Tampa, Florida 33601, appearing on behalf of Peoples 13 Gas System. 14 MR. REHWINKEL: Charles Rehwinkel, Office of the 15 Public Counsel, on behalf of the Citizens of Florida. 16 MR. MCWHIRTER: John McWhirter on behalf of the 17 Florida Industrial Gas Users Group. 18 MS. KLANCKE: And Katherine Fleming and Caroline 19 Klancke on behalf of the Commission. 20 MS. HELTON: And Mary Anne Helton, advisor to the 21 Commission. 22 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. 23 I guess we'll take up preliminary matters. 24 Staff, are there any preliminary matters that we need to 25 address before we get to the draft prehearing order?

MS. KLANCKE: Commissioner, there are currently two 1 pending requests for confidential classification which will be 2 addressed by separate order. To my knowledge, there are no 3 4 other preliminary matters. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. At this point we're 5 going to proceed through the draft prehearing order. And as we 6 go through the order, I'll identify the sections, and if the 7 parties could please let me know if there are any corrections 8 9 or changes that need to be made. And we may move quickly through most of this, so please speak up or forever hold your 10 peace, if you don't have a change or correction. 11 12 Section I, case background. 13 Hearing no objections, Section II, conduct of 14 proceedings. Section III, jurisdiction. 15 Section IV, procedure for handling confidential 16 information. And I believe staff has mentioned the two pending 17 18 motions. 19 Section V, prefiled testimony, exhibits; witnesses. Are the parties willing to shorten or dispense with the witness 20 summaries of testimony? And, if not, five minutes are 21 typically provided, so if the parties could briefly comment on 22 23

With respect to shortening or dispensing of the witness summary testimony, are the parties willing to shorten

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or dispense with the witness summaries of testimony? 1 2 MR. WATSON: We could do that. 3 COMMISSIONER SKOP: I'm not trying to -- I'm just 4 trying to seek to --5 MR. WATSON: Let me ask. MR. REHWINKEL: From the Public Counsel's standpoint, 6 to the extent we don't have any further discussions about 7 stipulated witnesses, I think we probably would like to have no 8 more than five minutes. 9 10 **COMMISSIONER SKOP:** Okay. 11 Mr. McWhirter. 12 MR. McWHIRTER: Are you talking about opening 13 statements? COMMISSIONER SKOP: No. Just basically for each 14 15 witness summarizing their testimony. MR. MCWHIRTER: I don't have any witnesses, so I 16 17 won't speak to that. COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. I just think in the 18 19 interest of procedural, I think we will just move forward hearing the concern from OPC that we'll allow witnesses to have 20 21 five minutes to briefly summarize their testimony, and that will apply for each of the respective parties. 22 23 And, again, there have been witnesses, to my 24 understanding, staff, that have been fully stipulated, and 25 those are in the process of getting concurrence so that we can

release those witnesses, should that be approved by each of the respective Commissioners. And I guess staff is in that process of confirming.

And, also, too, any other witnesses that the parties may wish to stipulate, please bring that to our attention or staff's attention at this time, or in the future. We'll deal with those on a case-by-case basis.

MR. WATSON: All right. I'd like to bring up one right now, and that's Alan Felsenthal.

MR. REHWINKEL: Yes. We agree that we could stipulate him, assuming that his deposition and testimony goes in, unless another entity wants to have him on.

MS. KLANCKE: Yes. His deposition transcript and exhibits to his deposition will be moved into the record as part of staff's composite exhibit. If you would provide me with just a moment to confer with staff to make sure.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Will do.

MS. KLANCKE: Commissioner, at this time staff does not have any objection to the stipulation of this witness; however, we will check and we will confer with the Commissioners to ensure that they have no questions for Witness Felsenthal.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you.

And then also to Mr. McWhirter, he is one of the intervening parties, so I think we need to ask his concurrence

whether he would be willing to stipulate to that witness.

MR. McWHIRTER: Yes, sir.

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COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Thank you.

Moving forward, Section VII, basic positions. Any comments or concerns?

Moving on to Section VIII, issues and positions. It's my understanding there's no dispute with respect to the issues as currently framed. Okay. If the parties would like to edit their positions, staff would suggest that the parties work directly with staff so that positions can be incorporated into the final prehearing order, should there be any changes necessary. And with respect to any additional stipulations, I would also ask the parties to work directly with staff to see if any additional stipulations could be achieved so that they could also be reflected in the final prehearing order.

Moving on to Section IX, exhibit list. Staff?

MS. KLANCKE: Staff would like to note for the record that we will prepare a Comprehensive Exhibit List consisting of all of the prefiled exhibits for the purposes of numbering and identifying the exhibits at the hearing. Staff will provide the exhibit list to the parties as soon as possible. Staff also intends to prepare a proposed stipulation exhibit composed of certain discovery responses and deposition transcripts which will be provided to the parties in advance of the hearing.

COMMISSIONER ARGENZIANO: Thank you.

Section X, proposed stipulations. My understanding 1 is there are proposed stipulations on the following issues, 2 Issue 2, 3, 16, 19, 21, 22, 27, 45, 47, 48, 51, 52, 53, 56, 58 3 and 59, is that correct? 4 MS. KLANCKE: That is correct. 5 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. 6 7 And pending motions. Staff. MS. KLANCKE: There are no pending motions at this 8 9 time. 10 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Moving on to Section XII, pending 11 confidentiality motions. I believe there's two motions pending 12 that will be addressed via separate order. Is that correct? 13 MS. KLANCKE: That is correct. 14 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. Section XIII, post-hearing procedures. I'd like to 15 ask the parties to adhere to the typical 50-word opening 16 statement and 40 pages for the post-hearing briefs. 17 everyone comfortable with that? Okay. Show it done. 18 For Section XIV, rulings, I guess I'd like to also 19 see opening statements limited to ten minutes, if the parties 20 21 have no objection to that. 22 Just looking to staff, any other matters that we need 23 to consider? MS. KLANCKE: Staff has no further issues at this 24 25 time.

MR. WATSON: Commissioner Skop, I'd like to go back to the listing of issues. I forget which section that is, because --

COMMISSIONER SKOP: I believe that would be Section VIII.

MR. WATSON: Section VIII. And this would be on what -- it would start on what I believe is Page 11 of what you're looking at. It would be Issue 4, and then on the next page, Issue 6. Both of these issues deal with potential adjustments to plant-in-service. And our feeling is that they don't need to be individually highlighted because they're subsumed in Issue 5, which is should any adjustments be made to projected plant accumulated depreciation and depreciation expense.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Let me stop you there just for the record. Just let the record reflect that we're looking at the draft prehearing order on Pages 11 and 12 for Issues 4 and I believe you said 6.

MR. WATSON: Six, yes.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: As currently framed. And if you could take those issues one-by-one, I think it would be better so that we could hear from the respective parties that may have some comments regarding those. So if you would start again with Issue 4.

MR. WATSON: Issue 4, the issue as stated is what are

| the appropriate unit costs for projected plant additions. And |
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| we believe this should be deleted as an issue, or as a |
| separately identified issue, because it's not really going to |
| provide any information with which to resolve the issues in |
| this case. And in any event, it is subsumed in Issue 5, which |
| is should any adjustments be made to projected plant. |

MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner Skop, this is Charles
Rehwinkel with the Public Counsel's Office. This issue in some
form or another was originally raised by our office. And as
the process of discovery has proceeded forward, the nature of
the issue has changed such that we agree that any remaining
adjustments that would be made under what we originally thought
was the relevant issue can be taken up and subsumed in Issue 5.
So unless there's another party that has a concern about that,
we can agree that it can be dropped.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Mr. McWhirter.

MR. McWHIRTER: I have no objection.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Show it done based on the comments of the stipulations by the parties that Issue 4 will be deleted from the proceeding.

MS. KLANCKE: Commissioner Skop, just one comment.

We have had the opportunity to confer with staff, and staff has
no objections to the omission of these two issues.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: And my apologies, I should look to staff, but I'm glad staff sees it my way.

Moving on to Issue 6, the same issue that could be 1 2 subsumed in Issue 5. And I would just like to hear a brief 3 statement, again, from Peoples Gas and then also from OPC whether the same stipulation could be achieved. 4 MR. WATSON: Well, I think you've just stated it, and 5 6 that is that the issue would be an adjustment to rate base, if 7 it is made, which is subsumed in Issue Number 5. 8 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And OPC has no objection 9 to that? 10 MR. REHWINKEL: We do not. 11 **COMMISSIONER SKOP:** Okay. Mr. McWhirter? 12 MR. McWHIRTER: No position. COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. 13 Staff. MS. KLANCKE: Although Staff has no objection, we 14 15 believe that this issue -- we concur that this issue could be subsumed in Issue 5. 16 **COMMISSIONER SKOP:** Okay. Show it done. 17 6 will be deleted and to be subsumed in Issue 5. 18 19 Any other comments or concerns regarding the issues 20 as currently framed by the parties? 21 MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner, I would like to state 22 for the record, prior to the prehearing conference starting, 23 Public Counsel and the company were sitting down in an effort to further refine and resolve certain pending issues, and I 24

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think we have made some progress. But I want to apologize to

you for being a few minutes late to the prehearing. We felt like it was fruitful, but I should have been on time.

and I think our staff would, as well as all of my fellow colleagues, the more stipulations that can be achieved, those are worth waiting on. So, again, if the parties on a forward-going basis find the ability to stipulate to the remaining issues, or some of the issues, that would be greatly appreciated, I think, by my colleagues and staff. So I would encourage the parties to look for latitude, and compromise, and consensus on issues that otherwise could be stipulated.

Staff.

MS. KLANCKE: With respect to how the stipulation of Issues 4 and 6 has affected the parties' positions, if at all, on Issue 5, if the parties could be proactive in providing staff with an amended or revised position with respect to that Issue 5, encompassing in a more macro way their revised position, that would be appreciated.

MR. REHWINKEL: I think at this time we don't have any, because we are waiting on some late-filed exhibits that I know the company is working to quickly provide. But until then, we won't be able to provide any additional numerical position.

MR. WATSON: We have several changes to Peoples' positions as set forth issue-by-issue in the draft prehearing

1 order that we didn't want to take the time in this proceeding 2 to go through, but we will obviously get those to staff as 3 quickly as we can. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Well, addressing that issue, any 4 5 changes in position, again, staff has ask requested -- it's for 6 their convenience for that to be submitted to staff by the parties by the close of business on February 24th, which I 7 8 believe is tomorrow. 9 So would Peoples be able to accommodate that as well 10 as OPC on any changes? 11 MR. WATSON: Yes, sir. 12 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And that is just for 13 Staff's administrative ability to do what they need to do to 14 meeting the hearing dates and getting the final prehearing 15 order out. So, just in summation, Issue 4 has been subsumed in 16 Issue 5 and deleted, Issue 6 has been subsumed into Issue 5 and 17 18 deleted, and that revisions to the positions of the parties will be submitted to Staff by close of business February 24th, 19 20 2009, which is tomorrow at 5:00. Staff, are there any other matters that we need to 21 22 address before we adjourn? 23 (Indicating no.) MS. FLEMING:

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COMMISSIONER SKOP: Any other concerns from the

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parties?

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
