



Dear Ms. Cole:

Pursuant to the Commission's vote at the February 24, 2009 Special Agenda in the above referenced docket, the return on equity ("ROE") for AUF's The Woods water system was reduced by 100 basis points to 8.75% due to an outstanding FDEP Consent Order dated April 26, 2007 [OGC File No. 07-0466-60-PW] that addressed TTHM and Haloactetic Acid exceedences (the "Consent Order"). The 100 basis point ROE reduction is to remain in effect until such time as the FDEP closes the Consent Order. Upon closure of the Consent Order, the ROE for The Woods system is to be increased to 9.75%, consistent with AUF's eighty remaining systems.

AUF has been advised that FDEP has now closed the Consent Order for The Woods water system. Attached is FDEP's letter affirming that the provisions of the Consent Order have been met and advising that the Consent Order and the case are now closed. Therefore, consistent with the Commission's decision on February 24, 2009, AUF respectfully requests that the ROE for The Woods water system be immediately increased to 9.75%. Furthermore, AUF respectfully requests that the revenue requirement for the system be increased accordingly and that this action be reflected in the monthly service rates that will be addressed in staff's recommendation to be filed March 5, 2009 for the March 17, 2009 Agenda. This action will result in administrative efficiencies, reduce noticing costs, and alleviate customer confusion.
