To the extent our August 16, 2008 letter constitutes a formal objection to the above transfer of facilities of Springside water and wastewater systems to FIMC Hideaway, Inc., we hereby withdraw our objections, if the transfer is approved by the Commission pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreement entered into by and between FIMC Hideaway, Inc., Par Utilities, Inc. and Fred Loughmiller. The hydropneumatic potable water tank which serves both the Springside & Hideaway communities was repaired on Monday the 23rd of February.

The residents were notified of the interruption in service and placed on a precautionary boil-water notice when the water was restored on Monday afternoon.

The repair was made on the inside of the tank (thus the interruption of service). The welder placed a small patch, roughly 8" x 10" over the pinhole leak and welded it shut.
