- Verizon has experienced a 40% drop in residential access lines since 2001, while wireless subscription has increased by 83% and broadband line growth has exploded statewide.
- Analysts anticipate another 25-30% reduction in the number of access lines by the end of this year for ILECs such as Verizon.
- In a recent article by the St. Petersburg Times, it was reported that Bright House Networks had over one million phone customers
