Dear Sir or Madame:

I am writing to you as President of the St. George Plantation Owners' Association, Inc. (SGPOA) to object to the Motion for a Variance filed by Water Management Service in its application for a centralized sewer system on St. George Island. SGPOA is a planned unit development on the western end of St. George Island. SGPOA consists of 950 platted lots. Currently, there are 550 homes and 400 vacant lots. There are approximately 1300 acres with 4.5 miles of Gulf frontage and 4.5 miles of bay frontage in the Plantation.

Owners in the Plantation have a vested interest in the wastewater decisions made on the island. Most of the homes built in the Plantation now have aerobic systems. It is our understanding that for a centralized sewer system to be commercially viable, the entire island would be mandated to participate in the centralized system.

Our objections to the filing are as follows:

No authoritative studies have been conducted to determine the causes of the pollution in Gulf and Bay waters.

No public hearings have been conducted to explore alternative solutions to address the pollution.

Approving this application would be pre-emptive and exclusive without sufficient public input and scientific data

The application is too vague.

SGPOA requests:

- 1. The Application for a Centralized Sewer System on St. George Island and the Motion for Variance From Portions of Rule 25-30.033(1) FAW, and Form PSC/ECR 009-W be denied.
- 2. A public hearing be conducted in Franklin County in the evening so the citizens can be heard on this issue and should follow the studies, analysis, and conclusions.
- 3. Adequate scientific studies be performed to determine the causes of the pollution in the Gulf and Bay waters.
- 4. The cost and impact of a centralized system be revealed.
- 5. Alternative solutions to address the problems are equally considered and explored.
