PROCEEDINGS

commissioner edgar: Good afternoon. I call this prehearing to order. I'll ask our staff to read the notice.

MR. JAEGER: Yes, Commissioner Edgar.

Pursuant to notice, this time and place was set for a Prehearing Conference in Docket Number 070231-EI, in re: Petition for approval of 2007 revisions to underground residential and commercial distribution tariff by FPL, and Docket Number 080244-EI, in re: Petition for approval of underground conversion tariff revisions by FPL.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

Let's take appearances.

MR. RUBIN: Ken Rubin for FPL.

would also like to enter an appearance for my partner, John. T. LaVia, III, on behalf of the MUUC, and the other municipalities named in our pleadings.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

MR. WRIGHT: Thank you.

MS. STERN: Marlene Stern, and I'd like to enter an appearance for Brian Armstrong on behalf of the City of South Daytona.

MR. JAEGER: Ralph Jaeger, and with me is Erik

Sayler on behalf of the Commission staff.

MS. HELTON: Mary Anne Helton, advisor to the Commission.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

MR. RUBIN: Commissioner, I'm sorry, I'd like to enter an appearance for John Butler, as well, for FPL.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: So noted.

Staff, preliminary matters.

MR. JAEGER: I believe the first thing we have, both parties are requesting that depositions -- I think MUUC -- is there a terminology we use for MUUC, or MUUC, or --

MR. WRIGHT: Madam Commissioner, I prefer MUUC. Others do use the homonym for the stuff in the Everglades. I prefer MUUC, and it's fine with us if we can -- to call MUUC, Coconut Creek, Jupiter Inlet Colony, and Palm Beach just collectively MUUC.

MR. JAEGER: Okay. MUUC, I think, wants to add the deposition of Mr. Shank into the record as an exhibit with all exhibits to his deposition, and FPL wants to do Mr. Rant's deposition with their exhibits. And we were discussing it, and they said it would just be like a parties' composite exhibit, the depositions of Rant and Shank.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And that's 1 agreeable to both parties that we'll go ahead and have a 2 composite exhibit introduced at the time of hearing? 3 MR. RUBIN: Yes, Commissioner. 4 MR. WRIGHT: Yes, Commissioner. Thank you. 5 **COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Okay. So noted. 6 7 Any other preliminary matters? MR. JAEGER: None that I know of, just some 8 confidential matters and a pending motion. 9 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And shall we take 10 those up as we come to that section of the prehearing 11 12 order? MR. JAEGER: That will be fine with me. 13 14 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Then any other 15 comments from the parties before we go through 16 section-by-section? 17 MR. WRIGHT: I would just --COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Wright. 18 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you, Commissioner. 19 20 I would just mention that we are -- FPL filed 21 its rebuttal testimony on Friday, the 15th. We are 22 going to take the deposition of their witnesses, 23 Mr. Koch and Mr. McEvoy. Mr. McEvoy this Thursday, the 24 21st, Mr. Koch on Wednesday, the 27th. It is possible 25 that we might seek to enter those deposition transcripts

1 as exhibits, but, obviously, we can't do that yet. 2 just wanted you to be aware of that. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. I appreciate that. 3 I understand. 4 5 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you. 6 MR. RUBIN: Commissioners, one other item for 7 FPL, as well. We are waiting to receive a late-filed 8 exhibit, and depending upon what we receive 9 substantively within that exhibit, it may give rise to 10 an additional exhibit or exhibits on the part of FPL. 11 We have a motion pending to serve supplemental 12 rebuttal testimony, and it's possible that that 13 supplemental rebuttal testimony may have an additional 14 exhibit with it. We just won't know that until we get 15 it. 16 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And that 17 supplemental rebuttal testimony, the request is 18 submitted by May 22nd, is that correct? 19 MR. RUBIN: That's correct, Commissioner. 20 MR. WRIGHT: It is an agreed motion, and we 21 are in agreement with FPL's motion for leave to file the 22 supplemental rebuttal testimony. 23 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. And I 24 appreciate the joint cooperation. 25 Okay. Anything else before we go through the

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draft prehearing order by section?

Okay, hearing none. We have all been through this together before. As always, I'll just kind of walk through them quickly. If there is anything, wave, speak up, and we'll stop and go over it in more detail.

Anything on Section I, Case Background? Okay.

Sections II and III, Conduct and Jurisdiction. Hearing none. Section IV, Procedure for Confidential

Information.

Mr. Jaeger, did you want to speak to something on the confidential information?

MR. JAEGER: Apparently -- at one time I thought we were not going to have any confidential documents, but they have now -- FPL has done a notice of intent for TRK Exhibit 10 to Mr. Koch's testimony, and then we're still not sure if the deposition from Peter J. Rant's deposition, Late-filed Exhibit 2, and so those two are the confidential matters that we have pending.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And those will be addressed prior to hearing?

MR. JAEGER: Yes. We haven't even -- we haven't gotten the motion for either one yet, and so we're waiting to determine if those motions should be granted.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. We'll move on.

Section V, Prefiled Testimony. As is general practice, five minutes for summaries.

Okay. Section VI, Order of Witnesses. Any opportunity to stipulate a witness? Hearing none, so noted. I always have to ask.

Section VII, Basic Positions for the issues.

Section VIII, Issues and Positions. No changes? No changes at this time.

Section IX, Exhibit List. Staff.

MR. JAEGER: Yes. Staff is preparing a

Comprehensive Exhibit List consisting of all the

prefiled exhibits for the purposes of numbering and

identifying the exhibits at hearing, and staff will

provide the exhibit list to parties as soon as possible.

And that will include the Staff's Composite Exhibit 2,

and then this added exhibit that we just had for the

depositions of Mr. Rant and Mr. Shank.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay.

Section X, Proposed Stipulations.

MR. JAEGER: Other than the stipulation for the two deposition exhibits, and also they have stipulated to Staff's Composite Exhibit 2 for the four sets of data requests less the confidential portion of FPL's response to Staff's Second Data Request.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay.

1 Section XI, Pending Motions we have discussed. 2 Mr. Wright. 3 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you, Madam Commissioner. 4 We and FPL are in substantive agreement as to 5 our positions on Issues 3 and 6, which are if the 6 Commission were to decide that the CIAC type charges as 7 a result of this hearing should be less than those paid 8 in the meantime, that affected customers or applicants 9 should get refunds. We have not agreed on language, but 10 I would propose that Mr. Rubin and we get together and 11 see if we can't nail that down so we could have stipulations on the generic form of relief on those 12 13 issues. 14 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. So the potential 15 for proposed stipulations for Issue 3 and 6 prior to 16 hearing? 17 MR. WRIGHT: Yes, Commissioner. 18 MR. RUBIN: Yes, Commissioner. 19 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. So noted, thank 20 you. 21 Okay. Section XII. Anything else on 22 confidentiality or the specific language in the draft 23 order? 24 Hearing none. Section XIII, Post-hearing 25 Procedures.

Mr. Wright. 1 MR. WRIGHT: Thank you, Commissioner Edgar. 2 I would simply request that we be allowed 50 3 pages for briefs rather than the 40 that's set forth in 4 the draft prehearing order. 5 MR. RUBIN: No objection. 6 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. With no objection, 7 so noted, and we will change the wording to 50 pages as 8 9 the limitation. Section XIV. Opening statements; five 10 11 minutes? Mr. Wright. MR. WRIGHT: I would like a little more than 12 five. I don't think I need ten. I was going to go for 13 14 seven, if that would be agreeable. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Rubin, do you have a 15 16 preference? 17 MR. RUBIN: That would be fine. Seven minutes 18 is fine. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Seven minutes. Okay. 19 I like opening statements. That's just one of 20 21 five, but I like to have opening statements. But seven 22 minutes, considering the issues, sounds appropriate to 23 me, so we will ask our staff to change the language in 24 Section XIV to allow a maximum of seven minutes per 25 party for opening statements.

Anything else? 1 Section -- I guess that's it for the sections, 2 isn't it? Any other matters while we are all gathered 3 4 here together? Staff. 5 MR. JAEGER: If their positions change on, 6 like, 3 and 6, and if we have a stipulation, staff was 7 wondering if we could get that by Tuesday of next week. 8 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Recognizing that Monday 9 is a holiday, does Tuesday work? I'm seeing nods, so we 10 11 will take that as an affirmative on the proposed stipulation language on Issues 3 and 6 to our staff by 12 13 noon on Tuesday. 14 Any other matters? MR. JAEGER: Staff is not aware of any. 15 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Anything from the 16 17 parties? MR. WRIGHT: No, thank you. 18 MR. RUBIN: No. Commissioner. 19 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: All right. Thank you. 20 21 I appreciate you all working together, and we 22 look forward to the hearing. We are adjourned. 23 (The prehearing concluded at 1:47 p.m.) 24 25
