OUC Renewable Figures

1. Question: Is there a maximum number of kW allowed on the residential PV program?

Answer: Based on OUC's interconnection requirements, there is a limit of 2,000 kW per customer site. The Pilot Solar Photovoltaic Program is limited to the first 600 kW of Residential and 2,000 kW for Commercial.

Question: What is the amount by which OUC subsidizes the low interest solar loan programs offered by the Orlando Federal Credit Union (OFCU)?

Answer: The percentage amount OUC pays to "buy down" the loans is illustrated in the tables below. The amount OUC has "paid down" on these loans since program inception through July 31st is \$18,723.
