PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA INC.'S RESPONSE IN OPPOSITION TO ATTORNEY GENERAL'S MOTION IN LIMINE

Progress Energy Florida, Inc. ("PEF") files this response in opposition to the Attorney General's ("AG's") motion in limine, and states:

- 1. On September 4, 2009, the AG filed a motion in limine requesting that the Commission enter an order specifying that any late-filed exhibits should be limited to the information requested or approved by the Commission. The AG further requested that no late-filed exhibit should be admitted unless and until the other parties have had an opportunity to cross-examine the witness who prepared the exhibit and had the opportunity to file testimony and exhibits in opposition to the late-filed exhibit.
- The AG's motion in limine in premature. Although late-filed exhibits are routinely accepted, and even requested, by the Commission, no late-filed exhibits have been (or could have been) requested at this point. It would be improper to enter a blanket order at this time limiting what may be relevant information prior to a party actually offering it into the record. If and when a party requests a late-filed exhibit and another party makes a timely objection, the Commission can rule at that time on a case-by-case basis on what conditions, if any, should be placed on its admission.

- 3. Late-filed exhibits can be filed both before and after the close of the hearing. When they are filed before the close of the hearing, they are little different than exhibits attached to rebuttal testimony. In both instances, opposing parties are given an opportunity for crossexamination. In neither instance is there an opportunity for the opposing party to file rebuttal testimony or exhibits.
- 4. For late-filed exhibits to be filed after the close of the hearing, the Commission may consider on a case-by-case basis what procedures are appropriate to protect the due process rights of the parties. It is simply premature to enter a blanket order on the handling of late-filed exhibits, particularly an order that would provide an absolute right to file additional testimony and exhibits in opposition to any such exhibit.

WHEREFORE, PEF respectfully requests that the Commission deny the AG's motion in limine, and determine the proper procedures for handling such exhibits on a case-by-case basis if and when a late-filed exhibit is requested and a timely objection is made.
