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PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Good afternoon. I'd like to call this prehearing to order. Commissioner Skop presiding. If staff could please read the notice.

MR. SAYLER: By notice issued November 13th, 2009, this time and place was set for a prehearing conference in Docket Number 090451-EM, the joint petition to determine need for Gainesville Renewable Energy Center in Alachua County by Gainesville Regional Utilities and Gainesville Renewable Energy Center, LLC. The purpose of the prehearing conference is set forth in the notice.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. We can take appearances.

MR. YOUNG: Yes, Mr. Commissioner. My name is Roy Young, and I'm representing the applicant in this matter, Gainesville Regional Utilities and Gainesville Renewable Energy Center, LLC.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Mr. Young. Are you also entering an appearance on behalf of Mr. Wright?

MR. YOUNG: Pardon?

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Will you also be entering an appearance on behalf of Mr. Wright?

MR. YOUNG: Yes.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right, thank you.

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Staff. 1 2 MR. SAYLER: On behalf of Commission staff, 3 Erik Sayler and Martha Brown. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And no advisory 4 5 staff? MS. BROWN: No, Commissioner. 6 7 COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right, thank you. 8 That brings us to preliminary matters. Are 9 there any preliminary matters that we need to address 10 before we get to the draft prehearing? MR. SAYLER: Not that I'm aware of at this 11 time. 12 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay, great. 13 At this point I'm going to go through the 14 15 draft prehearing order, and I'll identify the sections, and I want the parties to get me know if there are any 16 17 corrections or changes that need to be made. I'll go through this rather quickly, so, again, please speak up 18 19 if you have any changes or corrections that need to be 20 made. 21 Let's start with Section I, case background. Hearing no comments; Staff? 22 23 MR. SAYLER: No changes. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. 24 25 Section II, conduct of proceedings.

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Hearing no changes; Staff? 1 MR. SAYLER: No. 2 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Section III, jurisdiction. 3 Hearing no changes; Staff? 4 5 MR. SAYLER: No. Section IV, procedure for COMMISSIONER SKOP: 6 handling confidential information. Hearing no concerns; 7 Staff? 8 MR. SAYLER: No changes. 9 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Great. Section V, 10 prefiled testimony, exhibits, witnesses. Any comments 11 or concerns there? Okay. 12 I'd like to ask the parties if they're willing 13 to shorten or dispense with the witness summary? 14 Typically we provide five minutes. Is that going to be 15 16 acceptable? MR. YOUNG: Yes, sir. 17 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Staff, any concerns 18 19 on that? MR. SAYLER: No, Commissioner. 20 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Let's move to 21 Section VI, order of witnesses. 22 And at this point I just wanted to ask the 23 parties whether there is a willingness to stipulate any 24 25 of the witnesses at this point?

MR. SAYLER: At this time staff is not able to stipulate to any of the witnesses. We will contact the utility with regard to one or two potential.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. Thanks.

MR. YOUNG: I would point out the Mayor on, I guess it's Page 4, you'll note that the Mayor is listed as a witness there, and you'll note a footnote, she will be in Copenhagen for a meeting at the exact same time. And what we plan to do and hope to do is just substitute a witness at that time.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Show it done.

MR. YOUNG: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Let's move on to Section VI, order of witnesses. Actually, we just covered that, so I stand corrected.

Let's move on to Section VII, basic positions. Hearing no concerns. Staff?

MR. SAYLER: No concerns. Staff at this time is still in the midst of coming to its position on the matters, but staff also notes that staff is not required to take a position at this time or prior to the hearing.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. That takes us to Section VIII, issues and positions.

I just wanted to ascertain whether the parties had any questions about the issues, or I guess we could

1	go through the issues issue-by-issue, but if that's not		
2	necessary we can dispense with that and leave the issues		
3	as they are.		
4	MR. YOUNG: I think we're fine. Staff,		
5	hopefully, is still agreeable to stipulate on Issue 1.		
6	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Staff?		
7	MR. SAYLER: Staff is willing to stipulate to		
8	Issue 1.		
9	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Let me briefly turn to		
10	that.		
11	MR. YOUNG: And I think the other issues are		
12	the standard issues for a need case.		
13	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. Show that		
14	done. And that takes us to Section IX, which is the		
15	exhibits list. Hearing no concerns; Staff?		
16	MR. SAYLER: No concerns. Staff will also be		
17	providing a Comprehensive Exhibit List to the parties		
18	or Staff's Composite Exhibit List to the parties for		
19	potential stipulation.		
20	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well.		
21	That brings us to Section X, proposed		
22	stipulations. And as we just mentioned, there is a		
23	proposed stipulation on Issue 1 that has already been		
24	entered.		
25	Any additional stipulations?		

MR. SAYLER: None that I'm aware of. 1 2 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. That takes us to Section XI, pending motions. 3 None that I'm aware of. MR. SAYLER: 4 5 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. Section XII, pending confidentiality motions. 6 7 MR. SAYLER: There are several pending confidentiality requests and these will be addressed by 8 separate order. And we will notate that in the draft 9 10 prehearing order, as well. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Very well. 11 12 That takes us to Section XIII, post-hearing procedures. And, again, the current policy in terms of 13 14 the number of words in the post-hearing positions is typically 50 words and the max number of pages in the 15 post-hearing brief is typically limited to 40. Is that 16 17 going to be adequate for the parties? 18 MR. YOUNG: Yes, sir. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Staff is that going 19 20 to be --21 Yes, sir. MR. SAYLER: COMMISSIONER SKOP: Show it done. 22 23 And with respect to the next section, which will be Section XIV, rulings, I'm going to set a minimum 24 25 of five minutes for opening statements with not to

1 exceed maximum of ten minutes. And I just want to make 2 sure that should also be sufficient for the parties? 3 MR. YOUNG: Yes, sir. 4 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. Staff, any 5 concerns on that? 6 MR. SAYLER: No. However, could we just list 7 it as opening statements, if any, shall not exceed ten minutes per party? 8 9 COMMISSIONER SKOP: That would be fine. 10 Any other matters that we need to consider 11 before we adjourn? 12 MR. SAYLER: Staff will request, to the extent the parties' position changed due to discussion at or 13 14 following the prehearing conference, that they provide 15 any changes to staff by close of business on Friday, 16 December 4th, 2009. 17 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very good. And the 18 parties --MR. YOUNG: That's agreeable. 19 20 COMMISSIONER SKOP: -- can comply with that 21 deadline? Okay. All right. Any other matters before 22 us today? All right. 23 Hearing none, we stand adjourned. Thank you. 24 (The prehearing concluded at 3:45 p.m.)

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
