

Re: Sale of RECs from Florida electric generating facilities

Bonneville Environmental Foundation ("BEF") is authorized by the Center for Resource Solutions' Green-e Energy program to sell certain of its Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs)/renewable electricity as Green-e Energy Certified. A REC is a tradable commodity representing the environmental attributes of 1 MWh of electricity generated from a renewable source. As part of BEF's reporting requirement to Green-e Energy, this letter is to inform you of electricity generated by generators listed below. The electricity was provided to the utility without the environmental attributes, while the associated RECs were purchased by BEF and then sold to a third party. Under the rules of Green-e Energy, BEF must notify relevant regulatory authorities that BEF sold the RECs associated with the generation for which each utility purchased the power.
