PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: And that brings us to the electric conservation docket, 07.

Ms. Brown, preliminary matters.

MS. BROWN: Commissioner, staff points out that there are proposed stipulations on all issues in this docket except for Issue 9D. We are still working on a stipulation on that. We are going to meet after the prehearing conference to see if we can finalize it.

It's my understanding that FPL has filed revised schedules to indicate that regardless of how those negotiations turn out, they have removed all of the costs associated with the ESP project from the 2011 factors.

And that being said, staff has reviewed those numbers and will change those numbers in the final prehearing order, but they appear to be correct.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Butler.

MR. BUTLER: That is accurate. We e-mailed to all of the parties the revised factors and revised cost-recovery amounts for 2011 earlier today. We will file with the Clerk's Office tomorrow a set of the -- the complete set of the revised schedules so those are part of the record for the proceeding; but, yes, that is our intent. And I believe that we have avoided any issues over approval of the costs or the factors for 2011 by

taking those costs out of our projections. 1 2 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And to Mr. Beck, Ms. Kaufman, and Mr. Jungels, are we all comfortable there and 3 clear as to where we are and where we are going? I see 4 yes from Mr. Beck. 5 MR. BECK: Yes. 6 7 MS. KAUFMAN: Yes. 8 CAPTAIN JUNGELS: Yes. 9 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Thank you very much. Ms. Brown, any other preliminary matters? 10 MS. BROWN: No, Madam Commissioner, not that I'm 11 12 aware of. 13 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Then as with the 14 previous, we'll go through the draft prehearing order section by section. Speak right up. 15 Section I, case background. Section II, conduct 16 of proceedings. Section III, jurisdiction. Section IV, 17 procedure for handling confidential information. 18 Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits. 19 Section VI, order of witnesses. 20 21 Ms. Brown. MS. BROWN: 22 Yes. Commissioner, we mentioned earlier that we are 23 still proposing working on a proposed stipulation for 24

Issue 9D. And if we reach that stipulation, that will

make it an entirely stipulated case and the witnesses can be excused. We will reflect that in the final prehearing 2 order and notify the parties after we talk to the 3 4 Commissioners that they can be excused. 5 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Again, I am seeing no objections or concerns. So, thank you, and we will move 6 7 on. That brings us to Section VII, basic positions. 8 9 Any changes? MR. BUTLER: No. 10 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Section VIII, issues and 11 12 positions. MR. BECK: Commissioner, for Office of Public 13 Counsel, on Issue 9D we will be meeting after the 14 conference to see if we can stipulate. But if we don't, 15 we would like to change our position to agree with staff 16 on 9D. 17 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: To agree with staff on 9D 18 if the stipulation is not reached. 19 20 MS. BROWN: Yes. And if that happens, we will put that in the final prehearing order. 21 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Kaufman. 22 MS. KAUFMAN: Yes, that would be the same for 23 FIPUG. If we don't reach agreement on 9D, our position 24

would be agree with staff.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Thank you. 1 So 2 noted. Mr. Jungels. 3 CAPTAIN JUNGELS: FEA will continue to agree with FIPUG. 4 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. All right. 5 noted. Thank you. 6 Section IV, exhibit list. Ms. Brown. 7 MS. BROWN: Yes. Commissioner, we have prepared 8 a Comprehensive Exhibit List that includes staff's agreed 9 composite exhibit, a discovery exhibit, and all the 10 prefiled exhibits. We will probably be modifying that to 11 reflect the filing that Mr. Butler is going to make 12 tomorrow, and we'll have that up-to-date. We will send it 13 out to the parties and it will be available at the 14 hearing. 15 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. So the draft 16 Comprehensive Exhibit List as distributed to date showing 17 18 Exhibits 1 through 10 with the understanding that there 19 will be an addition prior to hearing. Any questions? 20 Okay. 21 Section X, proposed stipulations. 22 MS. BROWN: With respect to the proposed 23 stipulations, we note that OPC and FIPUG have taken no 24 position on those.

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COMMISSIONER EDGAR: But, of course, with

15	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I like to keep moving. I
16	told you, speak right up. That's fine.
17	MR. BUTLER: Going back to the proposed
18	stipulations, the copy I have of the draft prehearing
19	order, it doesn't show proposed stipulations for Issues 1
20	through 4. I think, based on what we have provided and
21	will be filing tomorrow as a revised factors, I think
22	there would be proposed stipulations for those issues, as
23	well.
24	MS. BROWN: That would be correct, and we'll
25	revise the final prehearing toward to reflect that.

1	MR. BUTLER: Okay.
2	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Anything else?
3	Okay. So noted. Thank you, Mr. Butler.
4	Okay. And that brings us to Section XIII,
5	post-hearing procedures.
6	MS. BROWN: If briefs are filed, they should be
7	no more than 40 pages.
8	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.
9	And Section XIV, rulings.
10	MS. BROWN: Opening statements should be limited
11	to five minutes per party.
12	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. And I think we are
13	almost done. Anything else regarding this particular
14	docket before we close it out for the day?
15	MS. KAUFMAN: Commissioner, I would just make my
16	same request, which is if we do reach complete stipulation
17	in the 07 docket, FIPUG would ask to be excused. If we
18	don't, we'll have someone here on our behalf.
19	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I'll look forward to seeing
20	you then, but I'm sure that there will be discussions
21	later. Thank you. So noted. And the staff will
22	coordinate with the Chairman's office.
23	Yes, sir.
24	CAPTAIN JUNGELS: I would like to make that same

1	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. So noted. Thank
