Vero Beach Complaint Issues - Docket No. 090524-EM:

- 1. Should the Commission find that the rate structure currently in effect for customers of the City of Vero Beach's electric utility is fair, just and reasonable and not discriminatory, as required by Rule 25-9.052(4)?
- 2. Should the Commission require the City to exclude from rates charged to non-city residents, any costs not directly related to the provision of electric service, including, but not limited to, the 6% of utility revenues submitted to the City's General Fund?

<u>NOTE</u>: This should also include direct contributions from the electric Enterprise Fund to the City Hall for salaries and benefits which amounts to about \$1.7 M year.

- 3. Should the Commission find that the City has complied with section 366.04(7) Florida Statutes?
- Should the Commission reopen the territorial agreement between the City and Florida Power & Light, approved in Order No. 10382, issued in Docket No. 800596-EU?
- 5. Should the Commission require[d] the City to offer conservation programs, similar to those offered by FPL?

NOTE: This should include rebates and also rates for different conservation equipment such as overnight chillers.

6. Should the Commission require the City to provide [equal] proportional representation with appointment by the respective jurisdictions for both city and non-city customers on decisions relating to electric utility rates which affect customers outside the city limits with ?

NOTE: This would make the method of representation the same as PSC § 366.04(7) (e) and appointment by respective jurisdictions would reduce possibility of City packing the representative body.

7. Should the Commission find that customers outside the city are being denied equal protection as set forth by Attorney General Opinion Number AGO 76-124 and AGO 90-72?

NOTE: The PSC should also include AGO 90-72 which also relates to equal protection.
