## **Questions for NPUC 10/20 Conference Call**

- 1) It appears that NPUC is assuming 100 percent of the customers in the territory it would acquire, would that take service from the utility. Please explain the basis for this assumption. What other information supports the need for this extension?
- 2) Mr. Hartman's July 17, 2014 letter states "[t]he second request by the county was to provide the future flexibility for wholesale service at VCUD Pelican Dunes package plant such that the County could shut down and just operate wastewater collection system if the County felt that was in their interest . . . . "
  - a. Is the County paying for the connection point and master meter for this flexibility?
  - b. When will the County be making a determination if the arrangement is in their interest?
  - c. Have there been any documents created that codify this arrangement?
- 3) Who will pay for the new collection lines on the streets that may be acquired?
- 4) If granted the territory extension, when will NPUC be able to handle service requests from all residential customers within Phase I.
- 5) If granted the territory extension, how will NPUC handle requests for service received prior to Phases II and III being completed?
- 6) Has the City, County and NPUC worked out a complete plan that illustrates all of the donated equipment (CIAC) that will need to be arranged to accomplish the presented plan?
- 7) When should we expect to receive the required affidavit needed for verification of noticing the proposed annexation to customers?
- 8) Please be prepared to discuss changes to the filing as discussed with Tara Hollis on August 28, 2014 with Sonica Bruce and Shannon Hudson. The service availability charge calculated by Tara Hollis does not match the service availability charge used in Mr. Hartman's documentation. (ECO)
