Pursuant to Section 366.093, (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) requests confidential classification of certain information filed in response to a staff data request in the above referenced docket dated March 2, 2016. This recommendation specifically addresses FPL's Responses to Staff's 1st Data Request, Nos. 7, 79, 81, 83, and 84.

The Company is claiming confidentiality of its responses to Staff's 1st Data Request, Nos. 7, 79, 81, 83, and 84, under Section 366.093(3), F.S. More specifically, all confidentiality requests (response Nos. 7, 79, 81, 83, and 84) are being made under 366.093(3)(d), F.S. and 366.093(3)(e), F.S. Per the Statute, propriety of confidential business information includes; "[I]nformation concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms," and Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S. "[I]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information."

Staff has reviewed FPL's Responses to Staff's 1st Data Request, Nos. 7, 79, 81, 83, and 84 and its confidentiality request. Details of the responses include: contractual pricing for spent nuclear fuel storage canisters (No. 7), agreement with Energy*Soulutions* for nuclear waste disposal (No. 79), agreement with Waste Control Specialists for nuclear waste disposal (No. 81), local union labor rates (Nos. 83 & 84). In staff's opinion, the information that is the subject of FPL's request meets the criteria for confidentiality contained in Sections 366.093(3)(d), and 366.093(3)(e), FS.
