I am writing to comment on the proposed FPL rate adjustment.

I have owned my home for nearly a quarter century. Have electric rates changed over that time? Of course they have, because the cost to produce electricity has changed over time.

For almost all of the time I have owned my home, I have received a monthly credit on my FPL bill for participation in FPL's On Call Program, for which I am grateful.

It seems reasonable to believe that if the cost to produce electricity has changed over the past 25 years, then the value to FPL of its customers participating in On Call should have changed over that time as well. However, the amount of my bill credit has remained the same for every month from the very beginning.

In order for any proposed rate adjustment, whether it is an increase or a decrease, to be truly fair and equitable, it must incorporate analysis of On Call credits and appropriate adjustments for same. It is time for such analysis to be done and such adjustments to be made. Given how long these credits have been stagnant, AT LEAST 25 years, but who knows how much longer than that, I would like to suggest that the Public Service Commission refuse to consider any rate adjustments going forward, including the current one, until due consideration, review, and proposed adjustments to On Call credits are included as part and parcel of any proposed adjustment to rates.
