Dear Florida Public Service Commission,

Energy efficiency programs play a critical role in lowering energy bills for all customers, especially those that can least afford high energy bills.

Duke Florida's performance on energy efficiency programs is unacceptable - 0.2% of revenue. Utilities in other states like California and New England states are greater than 1.5%. Even Duke Carolinas is 1.09%.

The Florida Public Service Commission needs to set minimum targets at 1% of revenue for energy efficiencies. Florida residents want the Commission to show they care about lowering consumer energy bills and reducing our impact on the environment!


