Dear Chair Graham,

The Florida Public Service Commission needs to give utility customers of Florida a fair shake by allowing a full evidentiary hearing on Rules 25-6.030 and 25-6.031 for the new Storm Protection Plan law.

These rules have not been permitted to be fully vetted and the hearing is being rushed. This is a complex case. The Office of the Public Counsel needs to be permitted to present a fully developed case in order to represent the interests of Florida ratepayers. We need full transparency in these rules so citizens can see what Storm Hardening Projects they are paying for.

I ask that you allow these rules to be reconsidered and ensure that there is full transparency in the process this time, so more citizens will have an opportunity to weigh in on these game changing rules that burden citizens with paying for storm hardening activities upfront and allow shareholders to profit from it.
