We really were looking at this today as a trial run to see if we had the technology and the capability to do this, and I could not be more impressed with the staff and the job that you have done.

Thank you to the participants for your willingness to work with us through this situation. I know it's not the norm, and it's going to be a little bit more difficult. I am going to try to make it as painless for you as possible today.

And third and finally, I want to thank my fellow commissioners. Your dedication and your continued support and the resources that you have helped to provide to this staff and organization is unquestionable. I appreciate all of your hard work and dedication during this time as well.

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a couple of ground rules on how we are going to get through this today, and we will see if we have any questions at the end. I am going to make certain that everyone who desires to do so gets an opportunity to speak. Everyone will be heard.

First of all, staff is going to introduce the items as they normally would. Then I am going to call on the known participants that have asked to speak on those specific items, and then I am going to follow that back up with another round of anyone else need to comment.

Then I am going to call on each Commissioner individually for your comments. And you can waive me off or make a comment. If you have specific questions for staff, Commissioners, if you would, direct -- begin your question with that staff member's name so that they can take their phone off mute and be prepared to answer you.

Then after each commissioner has had an opportunity to comment or waive me off, I will be back and ask one more time if there are any commissioners that have any more comments. I don't want to miss anyone.
