Pursuant to Rule 25-9.044, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company (“FPL”) submits this notice of the change in ownership of Gulf Power Company (“Gulf”), and FPL’s adoption and ratification of Gulf’s existing rates and tariff on file with the Florida Public Service Commission (“Commission”). Enclosed for administrative approval is a revised tariff sheet reflecting the change in ownership of Gulf.


Effective January 1, 2021, Gulf was legally merged with and into FPL, with FPL being the surviving legal entity. However, unless and until otherwise authorized by the Commission, FPL and Gulf will remain separate ratemaking entities and will continue to maintain separate books and records for all regulatory and ratemaking purposes. In this regard, although FPL as the legal successor and operator must formally adopt and ratify Gulf’s existing rates and tariff, such rates and tariff will continue to bear the Gulf Power Company name as a function of Gulf’s separate ratemaking status.

For purposes of continuing safe and reliable electric service to customers in Northwest Florida, FPL hereby adopts and ratifies all rates, rules, classifications, and regulations of Gulf on file with the Commission and effective at the time of the merger with FPL. Enclosed for administrative approval are legislative and clean versions of the Gulf tariff Sheet No. i, which has been revised to reflect the merger of Gulf with FPL. No other changes to the rates, terms, or conditions of the existing Gulf tariff have been made or are necessary to reflect the change in ownership.

FPL does not request that a formal docket be opened. To the extent the Commission deems it necessary to acknowledge the change in ownership, FPL respectfully requests that the Commission do so. FPL requests that the revised Gulf tariff Sheet No. i be administratively approved.
