Dear Chairman Fay,

The Office of Public Counsel writes to provide you the attached information Sometime after the original Staff regarding the above-referenced case. Recommendation was filed, it appears a petition containing over 140 signatures and related correspondence regarding HC Waterworks, Inc. ("HCW") was received by the Commission's Consumer Assistance and Outreach division; however the petition, signatures and attached correspondence were not included in the public docket file prior to the May 3, 2022 Agenda Conference. The correspondence attached to the petition references the pending rate increase and various quality of service issues, such as the noise and odor from the sewage plant, the drinkability of the water, the effect of the water on customers' laundry, i.e., "stained clothing," and residents' attempts to communicate with HCW to resolve their complaints. The Commission provided the undersigned counsel the attached documents after the Agenda Conference. It appears the specifics of this customer service information were not available to Commissioners before the decision at the Agenda conference. Specifically, the Office of Public Counsel asks the Chairman and Commissioners to explore, given that this information was not available to the Commissioners in the rate case docket file, reconsideration on its own motion of the vote in a way that May 4, 2022 Page 2 of 2

would bring the item back to a subsequent Agenda. This would allow time for any procedural matters related to the docket contents to be addressed, and make the full context of information available to all interested persons.

Please advise whether we can provide further assistance to the Commission.

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We are residents of Covered Bridge a 55+ community located in Highlands County. We have unsuccessfully tried to resolve our issues with HC Waterworks owners of the water treatment & sewage plants in our community. They are serviced by U.S. Water Service Corporation.

I have made several calls and also met the Corporate Utility Manager for U.S. Water Service Corp. regarding our complaints.

I have enclosed a copy of a petition signed by 154 of the residents. This is just a sampling of the residents who are affected by the noise, smells and quality of the water.

Also I have enclosed a copy of the letter to the Florida Department of Health in Highlands County.

According to the Corporate Utility manager she told us the decibels are acceptable under Highlands County regulations. However, she took the reading from across the road from the front gate of the Sewage plant. <u>The plant itself is located in the back of the fenced area directly</u> <u>north of our back yards. There are not any tall trees planted between the facility and the</u> <u>surrounding fence. We are exposed the loud noise emitted by the plant each time it runs which</u> <u>varies from 15 min. to 1 ½ hrs.at a time. We hear the noise in our bedrooms and find it difficult</u> <u>to sleep. Sitting on your porches is almost impossible due to the annoying noise and</u> <u>sometimes the disgusting odors depending on which way the wind is blowing.</u>

We are in need of having these problems resolved.

We, the residents of Covered Bridge in Lake Placid, Florida wish to file a formal complaint against the **Water/ Sewage Plant** located on the West by High Grove Ave. and on the East by Woodside Drive.

The <u>noise</u> from the Water Sewage plant has been lessened since yesterday but it can still be heard running for longer periods of time than the 15 minute period of time we have been guaranteed it would be. The <u>sewage odor</u> is disgusting and affects our daily lives. We find it is difficult to sit on patios/porches or enjoy cooking and eating **and struct**. According to a Corporate Utility Manager for U.S. Water Service Corp. there is nothing the kan do about the smell. <u>We feel this is not an</u> <u>acceptable answer</u>.

The residents homes located near the Drinking Water Treatment Plant on the West on Woodside Drive and surrounding areas, have been promised for many years that a 40 foot high pipe would be erected to exhaust the fumes emitted from the plant. However, the 40 foot pipe to exhaust the odors was never completed as promised to residents.

U,S, Water Corp. has made some improvements over the last few years to the Drinking Water Treatment Plant. However, the residents still smell the odors from this Water Plant.

These 2 facilities are serviced by U.S. Water Services Corporation.(In the Covered Bridge Community) Lake Placid, Florida. However the owner HC Waterworks is responsible for making repair and upgrade decisions.

We find it difficult to accept a water rate increase again this year when our request for better service has not been satisfied.

RE: Raw sewage smell

I am writing today to see if anyone will help with our situation. We purchased on 02/09/21 a parcel of land known as a Lot in Covered Bridge (a 55+ community) located in Lake Placid, FL. Our retirement home was to be built by the Cottage Company.

We moved into our newly built home in the end of January 2022. Two days after moving in, we were sitting on our back screened in porch and heard a rather loud and annoying noise that seemed to continue on for a very long time. Then we smelled the horrible odor of raw sewage waste. We retreated into our house and closed all doors so the smell would not come into our home.

It was never disclosed to us by the property owner/contractor (formerly known as Co-Construct), now known as X-Urban Construction that the Lot was located 1 house away from a Water Sewage Treatment Plant. On April 12th or 13th, 2022 a sign was finally posted on the fence that it is a Water Sewage Treatment Plant. (A little late wouldn't you say?

I have called U.S. Water Service Corporation on several occasions regarding the noise and smell. They said they were working on the loud noise but could not do anything about the odors.

I have also spoken with Ken LeBlanc the owner of the property (that was sold to us). He stated that it must have been an oversight that we were not informed of the Sewage Treatment Plant. He also stated that he had had several complaints and he had several conversations regarding these issues.


These odors are a HEALTH issue. We shouldn't be subjected to breathing in the raw sewage odors. Others in the houses located near the plant complain about the odors. Residents who walk their dogs around the area also smell the awful odors.

We are hoping that this Sewage Treatment Plant can be checked into on our behalf.

After many calls to the your company complaining about the Sewage Plant's loud sound and raw sewage odors I have decided to take further action to see if these problems can be resolved.

Attached you will find a copy of the Petition signed by 154 home owner's in the Covered Bridge 55+ community. This is only a sampling of the homeowners affected by the plants. These people have all been impacted by the sound, odors and water quality. Depending on which direction the wind blows depends upon who is subjected to the odors. The sound affects those of us who live closer to the plant. The sound was very loud. The noise lessened for a few days and is now loud again. The odor is still a problem.

The water plant emits a terrible sulfur odor and the water is not drinkable the closer you live to the pant. The water has stained clothing also.

Something needs to be done to fix these problems!
