1 PROCEEDINGS 2 CHAIRMAN FAY: Next, we will take up Item No. 3 2, and we'll give everyone a chance to grab their seats before we move on to that item. 4 5 Ms. Harper, you are recognized. Thank you. Good morning. 6 MS. HARPER: I'm 7 Adria Harper with Office of General Counsel. I'm 8 here today with Item 2. Item 2 addresses whether 9 the Commission should repeal a number of obsolete 10 rules, including rules 2525.001 through 2525.030, 11 which we refer to as the Commission's purchasing 12 rules. Rules 25-22.02 and Rules 25-22.100, .101, 13 .1035, .104, .105 and .107, which largely address 14 the Commission clerk's internal filing procedures, as well as rule 25-22.033, the staff communications 15 16 rule. The joint administrative procedure 17 committee, aka JAPC, staff recently reviewed these rules and submitted letters to the Commission 18 19 questioning the authority, necessity and form of 20 these rules. Staff is, therefore, recommending the 21 repeal of all of these rules. Staff would like to 22 note that with regard to Rule 25-22.033, the 23 communication rule, OPC raised a concern about the 24 effects of the appearance of repealing the rule 25 with respect to subsection five of that rule,

1 specifically. Staff had discussions with OPC that resolved OPC's concerns. 2 OPC wishes to address the 3 Commission about this resolution and staff is also 4 available for questions. Thank you. 5 CHAIRMAN FAY: Great. Thank you, Ms. Harper. If we could, I'll recognize Office of Public 6 7 Council to address the Commission on this item. 8 Mr. Rehwinkel, you're recognized. 9 MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and 10 thank you to your staff. Commissioners, this rule 11 repeal I concur that staff's on solid legal ground 12 for taking the action that they are. When I saw 13 the repeal proposal for 2522-033(5), it was like 14 traveling back in time. I was at the Commission in 15 1993 when this particular rule was adopted, adopted 16 at a time of a lot of misery at the Commission, and 17 is no reflection on the current Commission. But it 18 was adopted for a really good reason, because there 19 were problems. And the concern that I had that I 20 raised with your general counsel was that if this 21 rule is repealed, and it's the sentence that says, 22 no commit -- no commission employee shall directly 23 or indirectly relay to a Commissioner any 24 communication from a party or an interested person 25 which would otherwise be a prohibited ex parte

communication, under section 330.42 Florida Statutes.

3 That was the -- that rule was adopted because there had been documented instances where that 4 5 provision was violated through communication with the staff that were intended to end up with the 6 7 Commission. Our concern was that if this repeal 8 came, it would create the appearance that your 9 long-standing practice over the last 30 years of 10 following that would be viewed as being no longer 11 in place. So I relayed this concern to Mr. 12 Hetrick, and he assured me that this provision in 13 here, given the JAPC's position, would be addressed 14 with an administrative procedure manual proposal. 15 And, if that's the case, the Public Counsel feels 16 confident that no one should make an erroneous 17 judgment that the repeal of this rule means that 18 there has been a change in the practice at the 19 Commission that encourages people to do what this 20 tenet says you couldn't do. Regardless of JAPC's 21 position about the authority of this rule, it's 22 been on the books and it's been subject to 23 enforcement over a long period of time. 24 I'm not opining about whether enforcement 25 would have been successful, but I think this rule

1 has been a strong disincentive for people to violate the intent of this sentence. 2 Taking this 3 sentence and putting it in your administrative 4 procedures that apply to your staff will, in my 5 view, and the Public Counsel's view, I think the public's view continue practice that you have 6 7 followed all this time, and it will -- it will 8 position the stricture on the staff and not there instead of in the statute when JAPC said --9 10 (technical interruption) -- so that's what I wanted 11 to bring up, and I really appreciate the fact that 12 when I raised this with Mr. Hetrick, he asked staff 13 They got their -- put their to do some research. 14 heads together and they came up with a solution 15 they proposed to me and the Public Counsel's Office 16 and we are in -- we support it.

17 CHAIRMAN FAY: Great. Thank you. And I do 18 I think that staff has appreciate those comments. 19 worked hard on these rules. And I -- you know, 20 there's a number of them on here. You spoke to 21 one, Mr. Rehwinkel, but these aren't always the 22 most exciting things to work on, repealing rules 23 that maybe the authority isn't clearly expressed in 24 the statute, but I think it's incumbent on us to 25 make sure that any operations that we're doing with

1 implementation of rules are clearly laid out in the 2 statute, and so I want to say thank you to you, Mr. 3 Hetrick, and your team for getting this cleaned up. I think it's an appropriate correction that we 4 5 maybe could have made a little bit earlier, but I think all your folks were working hard to get it 6 7 done with quick turnaround. 8 So, with that, Commissioners on Item 2, I will 9 take a motion. 10 We have a motion and a second to move all 11 issues on Item 2. 12 All those that approve say, aye. 13 None opposed. 14 With that, Item 2 passes. 15 Thank you, Ms. Harper. 16 (Agenda item concluded.) 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
