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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Let's proceed to the 03
3	docket.
4	MR. SANDY: Good morning, Mr. Commissioner.
5	Ryan Sandy on behalf of the Commission.
6	In regards to preliminary matters, I would
7	note for the record that representatives of St. Joe
8	Natural Gas Company have been excused from the
9	prehearing in the 03 docket.
10	I would also note that Type 2 stipulations are
11	pending in the 03, although, they have not been
12	finalized as of this morning. We are awaiting
13	confirmation from all the parties at this time that
14	they are amenable to excusing their witnesses from
15	the hearing scheduled for November 17th and 18th in
16	this matter.
17	I would also note as a preliminary matter that
18	staff has learned that Florida City Gas may have
19	had an error in its 2023 projections in the 03
20	docket. We are certainly open to hearing their
21	position on that particular issue at this time with
22	leave of you.
23	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Thank you.
24	So I will punt it over to Florida City Gas.
25	Do you have any positions on the errors in the 2023

1	projections?
2	MS. KEATING: There we go. Thank you,
3	Commissioner.
4	The company recently determined that certain
5	amounts associated with the LNG facility were
6	included in its projections for 2023, when they
7	should have been booked to base. The error was
8	discovered very recently. And based on the impact
9	that those revisions would have, we are proposing
10	to make those corrections in the actual estimated
11	filing next year.
12	We have discussed this issue with both Public
13	Counsel and with Commission staff. We understand
14	that they are amenable to that approach, but we
15	just wanted to make you aware of that and make sure
16	that was on the record.
17	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
18	Thank you.
19	Any other parties have any other preliminary
20	matters? OPC, you are recognized.
21	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Oh, I just wanted to address
22	the correction. And we are in agreement with that,
23	and we are in a position to facilitate Type 2
24	stipulations on all the issues with that
25	clarification. We just wanted to ensure that that

1	gets reduced to writing in the prehearing order so
2	that we can follow up and follow that next year as
3	well.
4	Thank you.
5	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Noted. Any others?
6	Okay. Seeing none, let's go through the draft
7	prehearing order now. I will identify the
8	sections, like I mentioned before. I may go a
9	little bit quick, so please speak up if you do see
10	something or would suggest a change.
11	Section 1, Case Background.
12	Section II, Conducted in Proceedings.
13	Section III, Jurisdiction.
14	Section IV, Procedure for Handling
15	Confidential Information.
16	Section V, Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits,
17	Witnesses.
18	MR. SANDY: Mr. Commissioner, as with the 02
19	docket, if no witnesses are excused, we would
20	recommend that a summary of their testimony is no
21	longer than three minutes at the hearing.
22	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Three minutes. That
23	sounds good.
24	Let's go to the order of witnesses, Section
25	VI.

1	MR. SANDY: Mr. Commissioner, as with the 02,
2	we would like to confirm with the parties that they
3	are willing to excuse all their witnesses. If so,
4	we would confirm with each of the Commissioners
5	that those witnesses may be excused if the
6	Commissioners have no questions. If there are no
7	questions, if they may be excused, we will notify
8	the parties their prefiled testimony and exhibits
9	will be entered into the record as though read.
10	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
11	Then let's move on to Basic Positions. Do the
12	parties have any changes to their basic positions?
13	Seeing none, if there is a change please do so
14	by the end of the business day tomorrow.
15	Let's move on to Section VIII, Issues and
16	Positions.
17	MR. SANDY: Mr. Commissioner, staff would
18	note, as with the 02 docket, in the event that any
19	of the parties take a position referencing no
20	position at this time, that that is not considered
21	a position pursuant to the OEP that's been filed in
22	the 03 docket, and it will be categorized as no
23	position in the prehearing order.
24	Also, pursuant to the OEP, if a party fails to
25	take a position about the time of this prehearing

1	conference, or at the close of business tomorrow,
2	they will waive their opportunity for conducting
3	cross-examination on any of the issues, as well as
4	filing a post-hearing brief on that particular
5	issue.
6	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Understood.
7	Parties, any other related matters that need
8	to be discussed? OPC, you are recognized.
9	MS. CHRISTENSEN: Yes. I think we, as we said
10	before, we are willing to facilitate Type 2
11	position or Type 2 stipulations on all of the
12	issues with the regular Type 2 stipulation language
13	included in the order, if we can confirm that. And
14	we can speak with staff counsel later regarding all
15	of those if need be.
16	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Staff, are you okay
17	with that?
18	MR. SANDY: Mr. Commissioner, we are happy to
19	work with OPC and facilitate that.
20	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. Sounds
21	good. It sounds like we are on the same page.
22	Move on to exhibit list.
23	MR. SANDY: I would note, Mr. Commissioner,
24	that a comprehensive exhibit list has been
25	prepared. We will be working with all the parties

1	to make sure they have no objections on the
2	comprehensive exhibit list prior to the hearing
3	currently scheduled in the 03 docket.
4	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Then let's move
5	on to proposed stipulations.
6	MR. SANDY: There are none at this time, sir.
7	However, it sounds as if we should have some
8	forthcoming very soon.
9	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Pending motions.
10	MR. SANDY: There are none at this time, as
11	far as staff knows.
12	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Great. Pending
13	confidentiality motions.
14	MR. SANDY: There are none, Mr. Commissioner.
15	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Post-hearing
16	procedures.
17	MR. SANDY: If the parties agree to waive
18	their briefs, then the Commission may rule from the
19	bench on the 03 docket. If there are issues that
20	must be briefed, we direct post-hearing briefs are
21	no longer than 40 pages.
22	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Excellent. All parties
23	in agreement with that? Makes sense. Excellent.
24	Let's going on to Section IX I am sorry,
25	Section XIV Rulings.

1	MR. SANDY: As with the 02 docket, in the
2	event it is necessary, we would recommend that
3	opening statements not exceed three minutes at the
4	hearing.
5	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent. All
6	parties in agreement with that, three minutes?
7	Sounds good.
8	Other matters. Are there any other matters
9	that need to be addressed before the prehearing
10	conference?
11	MR. SANDY: I am not aware of any other
12	matters it, Mr. Chairman.
13	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Simple enough.
14	Seeing seeing none, that concludes the
15	hearing for the 03 docket.
