I am the property owner at 9813 Little Gasparilla island, Placida Florida. I am also a General Contractor that has extensive experience in working in environments such as present on Little Gasparilla Island. I can tell you the attempt to install at a low pressure system will be a failure and a undue hardship on the residents off the island. The cost to install the system will greatly exceed any bid to install, as extreme difficulties will be incurred. The residential equipment will require massive ongoing maintenance, not only for the system pumps but also a generator to run them system when electricity is out, which is frequently. The water service the island currently has was poorly installed due to difficult conditions and a sewer system is much more difficult to install.

You have no information to substantiate any consideration to abandon the current septic systems the island has used for many years. No studies have been performed. I strongly urge you to deny the EU's application for wastewater service on the island.
