On behalf of Earth Ethics, Inc. and our members (2,200+) within Florida Power & Light (FPL) service areas, we urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to hold multiple public hearings regarding the proposed rate increase. We are asking that, at a minimum, the PSC host 5 public hearings in the panhandle of Florida - Pensacola, Fort Walton Beach/Destin, Panama City, Port St. Joe, and Tallahassee.

Earth Ethics is particularly concerned about the additional financial burden on consumers and communities across the state. At a time when many families are already struggling with the rising cost of living, higher utility bills will only add to their economic hardships, forcing difficult choices between essential expenses like food, healthcare, and housing.
