Once again I am requesting help to include our barrier island, Lauderdale be the Sea(LBTS)be include on the eligible list of the Public Service Commission's SSUP program for weather enhancements and underground power facilities.

This is a state program that the FPL has co-opted from the STATE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION to accept participants or not. Your agency is to protect our residents and municipalities whereas FPL is to enhance their bottom line .Proof of FPL's control of this program was when KEN Rubach the LBTS Deputy Town Manager wrote to the head of the Public Service Commission requesting inclusion on the eligible list. The response to this inquiry came from FPL saying that we will not be placed on the eligible list as it is for municipalities that have data supporting need for inclusion.

As a Commissioner of LBTS I have written to ask if the surrounding municipalities had to meet such scrutiny and if they have data on our vulnerability to be excluded or included on the list. I hope this message finds you in good spirits. My name is George Beebe, and I live in Lauderdale By The Sea at 2049 Tropic Isle. I am writing to you with a heartfelt request for assistance regarding the inclusion of our beloved barrier island in the Public Service Commission's SSUP program, which focuses on weather enhancements and the improvement of underground power facilities.

As you may be aware, this program, taken over by FPL from the State Public Service Commission, raises significant concerns about the criteria for eligibility. While I appreciate FPL's operational goals, it is crucial that the needs of our community and all municipalities are given equal weight. Recently, Ken Rubach, our Deputy Town Manager, reached out to the Public Service Commission, but we were informed that our request for inclusion was met with the stipulation that eligibility is contingent upon data demonstrating our need.

I cannot help but wonder if neighboring municipalities encountered similar challenges when pursuing their eligibility, and whether there is data available regarding our vulnerability in comparison. It appears that being on the eligible municipal list is a barrier to accessing the SSUP program, which raises concerns for all of us who call Lauderdale By The Sea home.

Being surrounded by municipalities like Pompano Beach, Lighthouse Point, and Fort Lauderdale, we experience the same weather challenges and vulnerabilities, especially when it comes to our aging power infrastructure. Since moving to our community in 2020, I have witnessed several distressing electrical failures, including transformer malfunctions that have led to power outages and even fires in our area. These incidents have caused damage to our homes and appliances and heightened our worries about the reliability of the services we depend on.

While I understand that FPL provides surge protection for a monthly fee, I feel that addressing the critical issue of infrastructure repair must take precedence over placing the burden on residents, many of whom are already managing

significant utility costs. During a recent service visit from an FPL technician, I was reassured that funding for upgrading the underground powerlines has been allocated and is simply waiting for scheduling, which gives me hope.

That said, I kindly ask for your compassionate support in advocating for the inclusion of Lauderdale By The Sea in the eligible list for the SSUP program. The safety and well-being of our community depend on this initiative, and it is vital that we receive the same opportunities for protection and enhancement as our neighbors.

Thank you for your attention to this matter that weighs heavily on the hearts of many in our community. I genuinely appreciate your guidance and support as we work together toward a brighter, safer future.

Good Afternoon,

I am writing to urgently request your support in including Lauderdale-by-the-Sea (LBTS) on the eligible list for the Public Service Commission's Storm Secure Underground Program (SSUP) for weather enhancements and underground power facilities.

As you know, the SSUP program is a state initiative designed to strengthen power infrastructure against severe weather. However, Florida Power & Light (FPL) appears to have significant control over participation, which raises concerns about fairness and transparency. This was made evident when our Deputy Town Manager, Ken Rubach, inquired with the Public Service Commission about our inclusion, only to receive a response—not from the Commission itself—but from FPL stating that LBTS does not qualify. Their reasoning? A lack of data proving our need, despite the fact that other nearby municipalities have been included.

As a long-time resident and taxpayer of LBTS, I have sought clarity on whether surrounding municipalities—such as Pompano Beach, Lighthouse Point, and Fort Lauderdale—were subjected to the same level of scrutiny. To date, I have not received a clear answer.

This exclusion is deeply concerning. LBTS is a vulnerable barrier island, surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean and the Intracoastal Waterway. Our weather conditions are identical to those of our neighboring municipalities, yet our aging power infrastructure is even more at risk. It is unacceptable that we should be left out of a critical program designed to enhance safety and reliability.

I urge your office to take immediate action to ensure LBTS is included on the SSUP eligibility list. We cannot afford to wait until a devastating storm proves what we already know—that our community needs protection. Our neighboring municipalities have been given the opportunity to safeguard their residents, and we deserve the same.

Thank you for your time and consideration. I look forward to your response and to working together to protect our community.
