As a customer and Florida resident, I object to the proposed rate base increase and the ROE because: (1) when the previous rate increase of 2021 was approved, FPL pledged they would reduce their charges during the next four years; ***that did not occur***, (2) cost of living for customers has increased, however compensation for executives is staggering, millions of dollars for the COO/CEO of FPL as well as head of their parent company. (3) corporate belt tightening needs to occur by 10% or more) reducing the outlandish compensation and perks paid to the executive level. *BE A FAIR AND JUST ROLE MODEL CORPORATION* Utilize web site for building rate payer confidence and streamlining correspondence costs and include 10% budget reduction.
