

To the Florida Public Service Commission,

I am writing to formally express my opposition to any further rate increases requested by Sunshine Water Services in \*\*Docket No. 20250137-SU\*\*.

Sunshine Water Services has requested and received numerous rate increases in prior years, and customers continue to bear the cumulative financial impact of these repeated adjustments. At a time when Florida residents are already facing rising costs for housing, insurance, food, and other essential services, additional increases to water utility rates would place an unreasonable and unfair burden on customers—particularly seniors, families on fixed incomes, and low-income households.

Water service is a basic necessity, not a discretionary expense. The frequency of past rate increase requests raises serious concerns about long-term financial planning, cost controls, and operational efficiency. Before approving any further increases, the Commission should require Sunshine Water Services to clearly demonstrate financial necessity and show that all reasonable alternatives to rate hikes—such as expense reductions and efficiency improvements—have been fully exhausted.

I respectfully urge the Commission to prioritize affordability, transparency, and consumer protection in its review of this docket. The ongoing pattern of rate increases is not sustainable for customers and should be carefully weighed when considering Sunshine Water Services' request.
