**Dear Florida, Public Service
Commission Clerk,**

I am a retired customer of Water Oak Utility in Lake County and am writing to oppose the water rate increase under Docket NO. 20250088-WU.

The proposed increase from an average of about \$15 per month to more than \$100 per month is excessive and would create serious financial hardship for retirees living on a fixed income. Water is an essential service, and customers have no alternative provider. An increase of this magnitude is neither reasonable or affordable. I also fear this could affect our paid amenities such as the restaurant which just reopened and the golf course. Residents may not be able to afford these. I also fear we will be losing our part time (snowbird) residents especially our Canadian residents.

I respectfully urge the Commission to reject or significantly reduce this proposed rate increase and to prioritize affordability and consumer protection for Residents of Water Oak
