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I have solar panels. And impact-resistant windows. I produce more electricity than I use. I got my panels at the end of '19. My bill was the minimum monthly bill Florida allows FPL to charge, and it was \$10.05 a month, every month, all year. In '22, your PSC let FPL triple my bill to \$30.17. Every month, all year. This year, you let them increase my minimum monthly bill again, to just over \$36. Every month. I have an electric car, too, which I charge at home, and that doesn't raise the bill, either. You care about FPL, not about Floridians. You excuse FPL from having a reason to modernize or innovate. My daughter and her family have solar panels, too. They live in a larger house than I do, and they have fewer panels. But they live in Massachusetts, which does not let the electric company charge a minimum monthly amount. My daughter's electric bill is often zero, and she sometimes gets a small check from the electric company, which receives the extra electricity she makes, and sells it to someone else. It's a terrible shame that the constituency of Florida government -- what Florida government cares about -- is things like FPL, and not Floridians.
