The purpose of this filing is to modify the Company's intrastate switched access rates and charges. The modifications are in response to the Federal Communications Commission's Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed rulemaking, WC Docket Nos. 10-90 et al., FCC 11-161 (Released Nov 18, 2011).

Additional Switched Access rates are changing due to the Company exiting the NECA pool/tariff for interstate services, and to be in compliance with FCC Rule 51.909 (a)(4) and (a)(6) that requires companies to remain at parity for terminating intrastate and interstate switched access services. The Company will participate in the JSI tariff for interstate access services.

The effective date of the tariff change is July 1, 2014.
