#### Jeff,

I've finally found the discrepancies you listed in your October response to my filing, and the discrepancies are due to revisions dated July 29, 2017 which were published by Level 3 Communications, but were apparently not filed with the FL PSC. I had to review the Telview database we subscribe to, to figure this out. I've attached those pages, which were in the "master" tariff I received when CenturyLink acquired this company. I'm certain these changes were associated with the sixth step in implementing Terminating Switched End Office and Terminating Tandem Switched Access Service reductions mandated in FCC's Transformation Order in WC Docket Nos. 10-90, etc. (FCC 11-161). Since this occurred before the company was affiliated with CenturyLink, I can't speculate as to whether the company attempted e-filing these changes with the FL PSC or whether someone assumed this "price list" wasn't on file and just published the pages on the company's website at that time. However, based on the fact that the revision levels in 1, 3, and 4 below were associated with those FCC mandated changes, I need your help and advice as to how we can get those on record in PSC files.

- 18<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 1 should be 17<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 1. Currently, 16<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 1, filed on July 30, 2014 in T20140102, is in the current price list and was effective on July 31, 2014. 17<sup>th</sup> Revised CheckSheet Page 1 was updated to reflect revisions for Pages 57 and 58.
- 2. 2<sup>nd</sup> Revised Page 2 page numbering in the body of the page contains formatting errors. This page accurately presents the page numbers on my word version of this file. Converting it to pdf created the error that I see has been merged into the master file maintained by the PSC. I will need to send you a new version of that page so that you can replace the version showing "Error! Bookmark not defined."
- 15<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 57 should be 14<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 57. Currently, 13<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 57, filed on July 30, 2014 in T20140102, is in the current price list and was effective on July 31, 2014. 14<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 57 replaced the terminating MOU rates in Section 15.1.3.4.3 with a footnote concurring with the company's interstate rate, effective July 29, 2017.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 58 should be 7<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 58. Currently 6<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 58, filed on June 27, 2013 in T20130107, is in the current price list and was effective on July 1, 2013. 7<sup>th</sup> Revised Page 58 eliminated terminating MOU rates in Section 15.1.3.7, effective July 29, 2017.

After your review, please let me know what I can do so that we are in sync again. Thank you and again my sincere apologies for the delay.

15.1.4.1 – Rates Applicable To Local Connect Service

15.1.4.1.1 Entrance Facility/Direct Trunked Transport

To obtain Local Connect Service, the Customer must obtain a connection from its Premises in a local access and transport area to the Company local switch to which the Customer seeks to connect. To obtain that connection the Customer must purchase a combination of Entrance Facilities, Direct Trunked Transport, and DS1 switch ports, as well as multiplexing, if applicable.

The Direct Trunked Transport rate shall be applied per DS1-level, DS-3 level, or higher-level connection (for states in which multiple data rate options are available), at the appropriate per-month and per-mile rate(s) specified in Section 15.1.3.4.4 of this tariff. The Per Mile amounts shall be charged monthly and shall be calculated based on the distance between the Customer's premises and the Company local switch to which the Customer seeks to connect, calculated in accordance with Section 10 of this Tariff.

15.1.4.1.2 Multiplexing

The Company's network normally requires traffic delivered to its switches at the DS1 level. If a Customer chooses to obtain multiplexing/demultiplexing services to convert DS3 to DS1 level signaling, the Customer may obtain that service from the Company at the rates stated in Section 15.1.3.4.3. These rates apply per minute of traffic multiplexed or demultipled. If multiplexing between other data rates is required, the Company may provide such services in accordance with the terms of Section 11, Special Construction.

<u>End User:</u> A non-carrier customer of an intrastate telecommunications service. If a carrier uses telecommunications service for administrative purposes, it shall be deemed to be an End User.

<u>Individual Case Basis (ICB)</u>: A service arrangement in which the regulations, rates and charges are developed based on the specific circumstances of the case.

<u>Interconnect Carrier:</u> Any carrier that connects to Company's network for exchange of communications traffic.

<u>Joint User:</u> A person, firm or corporation which is designated by the Customer as a user of services furnished to the Customer by the Company and to whom a portion of the charges for the service will be billed under a Joint User arrangement as specified in the Company's price list.

<u>LATA:</u> A Local Access and Transport Area established pursuant to the Modification of Final Judgement entered by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 82-0192; or any other geographic area designated as a LATA in the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Price list F.C.C. No. 4.

<u>Major Service Interruption</u>: An interruption of Customer service due to the Company's negligence or due to its noncompliance with the provisions of this price list.



<u>PIU:</u> Percent Interstate Usage

<u>Premises:</u> The space occupied by a Customer, Authorized User or Joint User in a building or buildings or contiguous property (except railroad rights-of-way, etc.) not separated by a highway.

<u>Recurring Charges:</u> The monthly charges to the Customer for services, facilities and equipment, which continue for the duration of the service.

<u>Service Commencement Date</u>: The first day following the date on which the Company notifies the Customer that the requested service or facility is available for use, unless extended by the Customer's refusal to accept service which does not conform to standards set forth in the Service Order or the tariffs of the Company, in which case the Service Commencement Date is the date of the Customer's acceptance. The Company and Customer may mutually agree on a substitute Service Commencement Date. In the case of Tandem Connect service ordered under option (2) of Section 12.1.1.2, the Service Commencement Date is the date on which the Customer first sends Switched Access Service traffic to the Company or accepts Switched Access Service traffic from the Company.

<u>Service Order</u>: A written request for Company Services that may be submitted by the Customer in the format devised by the Company. The signing of a Service Order by the Customer and acceptance by the Company will initiate the respective obligations of the parties as set forth herein, but the duration of the service is calculated from the Service Commencement Date.

<u>Shared:</u> A facility or equipment system or subsystem that can be used simultaneously by several Customers.

<u>Switched Access Service</u>: Access to the switched network of an Exchange Carrier for the purpose of originating or terminating communications. Switched Access service includes Local Switching, Local Transport, and Carrier Common Line.

<u>Toll Free</u>: The terms "Toll Free" or "Toll Free Service" refer to an inbound telecommunications service which permits calls to be completed to the customer's location without charge to the calling party. Access to the service is gained by dialing a ten-digit telephone number which terminates at the customer's location or a location designated by that customer. 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#### SECTION 14 – SWITCHED ACCESS SERVICE

#### 14.1 General

Switched Access Service, which is available to Customers for their use in furnishing their services to End Users, provides a communications path between a Customer's Premises and a service obtained by an End User from the Company or (if the Switched Access Service is provided by more than one local exchange carrier as provided in Section 4.2.9 of this Tariff) from another carrier whose network subtends the Company's facilities. It provides for the use of common terminating, switching and transport facilities. 14.2 Provision and Description of Switched Access Service Agreements



FGD Access, which is available to all customers, is provisioned at the DSI level and provides trunk-side access to Company switches with an associated uniform 101-XXXX Access Code for Customer's use in originating and terminating communications. FGD service will be provided with SS7 signaling. (Multi-Frequency In-Band signaling may also be available, for a separate charge established under Section 11 of this Tariff.) End Users of Customer's service may also originate calls to certain FGD Access Customers without dialing the 101-XXXX Access Code if End User is presubscribed, as described herein.

The Access Code for FGD switching is a uniform Access Code of the form 10XXX. A single Access Code will be the assigned number of all FGD access provided to the Customer by the Company. No Access Code is required for calls to a customer over FGD Switched Access Service if the End User's telephone exchange service is arranged for Presubscription to that Customer, as set forth herein

Where no Access Code is required, the number dialed by the Customer's End User shall be a seven or ten digit number for calls in the North American Numbering Plan (NANP), except for 00- dialed calls which are routed to the predesignated Customer. For international calls outside the NANP, a seven to twelve digit number maybe dialed. The form of the numbers dialed by the Customer's End User is NXX-XXXX, 0 or 1 + NXX-XXXX, NPA + NXX-XXXX, 0 or 1 + NPA = NXX-XXXX, and when the local Switching Center is equipped for International Direct Distance Dialing (IDDD), O+ CC + NN or 011 + CC + NN.

#### **Non-Toll Free**

All calls that are not toll free (8YY) as established by the FCC's 8YY Access Charge Reform Order (FCC 20-143) released on October 9, 2020.

<u>PIU:</u> Percent Interstate Usage

<u>Premises:</u> The space occupied by a Customer, Authorized User or Joint User in a building or buildings or contiguous property (except railroad rights-of-way, etc.) not separated by a highway.

<u>Recurring Charges:</u> The monthly charges to the Customer for services, facilities and equipment, which continue for the duration of the service.

<u>Service Commencement Date:</u> The first day following the date on which the Company notifies the Customer that the requested service or facility is available for use, unless extended by the Customer's refusal to accept service which does not conform to standards set forth in the Service Order or the tariffs of the Company, in which case the Service Commencement Date is the date of the Customer's acceptance.
