ORDER EXTENDING EFFECTIVE DATE OF TARIFF

BY THE COMMISSION:

In Order No. PSC-92-0401-FOF-TL, Docket No. 910967-TL, the Commission approved GTE Florida Incorporated's (GTEFL or the Company) tariff proposal to reprice and restructure local (intraexchange) private line services with an effective date of August 1, 1992. On June 4, 1992, GTEFL filed a request for an extension of the effective date of the tariff until September 1, 1992. The Company indicated programming problems and delays in internal service order activity would not allow for adequate customer notice. GTEFL stated that the additional time would allow the Company to complete the programming necessary to generate the required customer impact statements.

At the Agenda Conference held on July 21, 1992, a representative of Sonitrol Alarm Company objected to GTEFL's proposed effective date of September 1, 1992. GTEFL agreed at the Agenda Conference to an effective date of December 1, 1992. GTEFL agreed that an extension until December 1, 1992, would provide time for GTEFL to seek solutions to mitigate the impact of the restructure on the alarm company.

We approve the extension of the effective date of GTEFL's tariff to reprice and restructure local private line services until December 1, 1992. Our approval of this extension of the effective date of the tariff will adjust the phase-in dates of phases 2 and 3. These phases will be implemented on September 1, 1993, for phase 2 and September 1, 1994, for phase 3. GTEFL shall provide adequate customer notification of the revised dates as set forth in this Order.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that the effective date of GTE Florida Incorporated's tariff to reprice and


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restructure local private line services is extended until December 1, 1992. It is further

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.59(4), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request: 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting within (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water or sewer utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Director, Division of Records and Reporting and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
