ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED
AT RULEMAKING HEARING

I. Background

The Florida Public Service Commission has proposed new rules relating to conservation goals and a conservation performance incentive factor; has proposed amending current rules relating to general information, energy audits, and conservation end-use data; and has proposed the repeal of rules relating to evaluation of conservation efforts and normalization of load data. The proposed new rules, rule amendments and repeals were published in the Florida Administrative Weekly on October 23, 1992.

A hearing is scheduled at the following time and place:

II. Rulemaking Hearing

The rulemaking hearing shall be governed by section 120.54, Florida Statutes, and by Chapter 25-22, Florida Administrative Code.

III. Hearing Procedures

The following procedures shall apply:

1. The Commission staff will present a summary of the economic impact statement and the rules.

2. Following the staff presentation, affected persons will have the opportunity to present evidence and argument. It may be necessary to impose time limits for presentations, depending upon the number of participants. Therefore, participants should prepare to limit presentations to no more than 45 minutes. Persons with similar positions should combine to make one presentation. At the conclusion of the December portion of the hearing, if time permits, persons making presentations will be subject to questioning by other parties.

3. Testimony and comments may be prefiled, by filing an original and 15 copies by December 15, 1992.

4. Persons who wish to participate at the hearing must register at the beginning of the hearing. The general order of presentation will be as follows:

Members of the public
Investor-owned electric utilities
Municipal electric utilities
Cooperative electric utilities
Gas utilities
Office of the Public Counsel
Representatives of various interest groups

5. All alternate rule proposals must be made in writing, with copies distributed at the hearing. See Appendix "A" for suggested rule proposal format.

6. At the hearing, participants should organize their comments in the following order:

25-17.006	Electric Utility System Conservation End-Use Data (amendment)
25-17.007	Normalization of Electric Utility Load Data (repeal)

7. Beginning at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, January 20, 1993, those who participated in the December hearing will have the opportunity to present a summary of their positions. It may be necessary to impose time limits for presentations, depending upon the number of participants. Therefore, participants should prepare to limit their summaries to no more than 30 minutes.

8. Testimony and comments to be considered at the January portion of the hearing may be prefiled, by filing an original and 15 copies no later than January 10, 1993. Copies of all prefiled testimony and comments shall also be served by the sponsoring party on all other parties.

IV. Posthearing Procedures

1. A transcript of the December and January proceedings will be made available to the public at the cost of \$1.00 per page, as specified in Section 350.06(7), Florida Statutes.


2. Post-hearing filings and comments are due February 17, 1993.

4 (1) Proposed rules and rule revisions must be submitted in
5 writing, and must be typed, double-spaced, using type-and-strike
6 format.

7 (2) You may obtain a diskette copy of the proposed rules in
8 Wordperfect 5.1 rule format from Marsha Rule in the Division of
9 Appeals. The rules will be copied onto your blank, formatted high
10 density 3.5" diskette. Please redline suggested additions to and
11 deletions from the proposed version of the rules. Explanatory
12 comments should be keyed to the rule in some fashion, such as
13 through footnotes.

14 (3) Example of redlined additions with explanatory comment:

15 The Florida Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act requires
16 increasing the efficiency of the electric systems of Florida,
17 increase the conservation of expensive resources, such as petroleum
18 fuels, to and the end use of these sources of energy by reducing
19 reduce weather-sensitive¹ peak demand, ~~oil consumption~~ and kilowatt
20 hour consumption to the extent cost effective.
