

Dear Mr. Fasano:

During our residence in FL I followed with interest your attempts to obtain remedial action by Aloha Utilities, Inc to improve water quality and lower the exorbitant sewer rates. Aloha has another billing ploy which, in my estimation, is pure and simple a scam.

Early in 1998 we decided to return to IL. We moved prior to the sale of our home, had the water disconnected, (big mistake - no rain), and then had it re-connected. The house was empty with no garbage, trash, or re-cycling being generated. Aloha continued to bill me for the garbage fee. I wrote Aloha requesting an explanation for the fee and received no answer. I withheld the garbage fee on one bill, to see what would happen, and the fee showed up on the next bill as "past due." As the house sold I paid all the billings including the garbage fees. (Didn't want a goofy lien to foul up the closing.) Thus, Aloha and I are "even" so that is not the problem.

My question is how can Aloha bill for a service that is neither used nor needed? Is there something in the "franchise agreement" that allows this or is Aloha putting a few more dollars on the "bottom line?" I mentioned to Aloha that I was not in the habit of paying for a service that I did not use.

I realize that this is a minor matter until you multiply the errant "garbage fee" by the number of empty houses that still have water service from Aloha. This is not an earthshaking matter but it is irritating and a rip off.

Thank you for taking the time to read this and "good luck" in the primary and general elections.
