- 1. On July 23, 2001, the Staff of the Florida Public Service

Explanation of Proprietary Information

- 1. This information reflects vendor/customer specific information. Public disclosure of this information would impair BellSouth's ability to contract for goods and/or services on favorable terms. Pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statues such information is classified as proprietary, confidential business information which is exempt from the Open Records Act.
- 2. The information requested contains practices/procedures utilized by BellSouth to conduct business. This information, if released, would allow BellSouth's competitors to have free access to certain intellectual property which was developed at significant expense to BellSouth. BellSouth's competitors can use this information to develop their own strategies without the burden and expense of developing this property for themselves.
