ORDER CANCELING PAY TELEPHONE CERTIFICATE

BY THE COMMISSION:

Boy Scouts of America-Florida National High Adventure Sea Base (Boy Scouts of America), holder of Pay Telephone Certificate (PATS) of Public Convenience and Necessity No. 3816, has requested the cancellation of PATS Certificate No. 3816. Boy Scouts of America has complied with the provision of Rule 25-24.514(2), Florida Administrative Code, by providing adequate notice in writing of its request for cancellation of its PATS certificate. Accordingly, we find it appropriate to cancel PATS Certificate No. 3816, effective April 20, 2004. We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Section 364.335, Florida Statutes.

In addition, under Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual RAF of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. A RAFs Return notice for the year 2004 has been mailed to Boy Scouts of America for payment by January 30th. Neither the cancellation of its certificate nor the failure to receive RAFs Return notice for the year 2004 shall relieve Boy Scouts of America from its obligation to pay RAFs for the year 2004.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Boy Scouts of America-Florida National High Adventure Sea Base's Certificate No. 3816 to provide Pay Telephone services is hereby canceled, effective DATE. It is further

ORDERED that Boy Scouts of America-Florida National High Adventure Sea Base shall remit Regulatory Assessment Fees for the year 2004. It is further

ORDERED that this Docket is closed.
