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### TARIFF FORMAT SHEETS

- A. Sheet Numbering Sheet numbers appear in the upper right corner of the page. Sheets are numbered sequentially. However, new sheets are occasionally assed to the tariff. When a new sheet is added between sheets already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new sheet added between sheets 14 and 15 would be 14.1.
- B. Sheet Revision Numbers Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each page. These numbers are used to determine the most current sheet versions on file with FPSC. For example, the 4th revised Sheet 14 cancels the 3rd revision sheet 14. Because of various suspension periods, deferrals, etc., the FPSC follows in their tariff approval process, the most current sheet number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff page in effect. Consult the Check Sheet for the sheet currently in effect.
- C. Paragraph Numbering Sequence There are nine levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:

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D. Check Sheets – When a tariff filing is made with the FPSC, an updated check sheet accompanies the tariff filing. The check sheet lists the sheets contained in the tariff, with a cross reference to the current revision number. When new pages are added, the check sheet is changed to reflect the revision. All revisions made in a given filing are designated by an asterick (\*). There will be no other symbols used on this page if these are the only changes made to it (i.e., the format, etc. remains the same, just revised revision levels on some pages). 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# **SECTION 1 – TECHNICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS**

Access Line- An arrangement which connects the customer's locations to the Company's network switching center.

Authorization Code - A numerical code, one or more of which are available to the customer to enable him/her to access the carrier, and which are used by the carrier both to prevent unauthorized access to its facilities an to identify the customer for billing purposes.

Company or Carriers - TeleLink Communications Corp

Customer - the person, firm, corporation or other entity which orders services and is responsible for payment of charges due and compliance with the Company's tariff regulations.

Day – From 8:00 AM up to but not including 5:00PM local time Sunday through Friday.

Evening – From 5:00 PM up to but not including 11:00 PM local time Sunday through Friday.

Holidays – The company's recognized holidays are New Years Day, July 4<sup>th</sup>, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.

Night/Weekend – From 11:00 PM up to but not including 8:00 AM Sunday through Friday, and 8:00 AM Saturday up to but not including 5:00 PM Sunday.

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# **SECTION 2 - RULES AND REGULATIONS**

# 2.1 Undertaking of the Company

The Company's services and facilities are furnisherd for communications originated at specified points within the state of Florida under terms of this tariff.

The Company's installs operates, and maintains the communications services provided herein in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth under this tariff. It may act as the customer's agent for ordering access connection facilities provided by other carriers or entities when authorized by the customer, to allow connection of a customer's location to the company's network. The customer shall be responsible for all charges due for such service arrangement.

The Company's sevices and facilities are provided on a monthly basis unless ordered on a longer term basis, and are available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

### 2.2 Limitations

- 2.2.1 Service is offered subject t the availability of facilities and provisions of this tariff
- 2.2.2 The Company reserves the right to discontinue furnishing service, or limit the use of service necessitated by conditions beyond its control: or when the customer is using service in violation of the law or the provisions of this tariff.
- 2.2.3 All facilities provided under this tariff are directly controlled by the Company and the customer may not transfer or assign the use of service or facilities, except with the express written consent of the company. Such transfer or assignment shall only apply where there is no interruption of the use or location of the service or facilities.
- 2.2.4 All regulations and conditions contained in this tariff shall apply to all such permitted assignees or transferees, as well as all conditions for service.

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# 2.3 Liabilities of the Company

- 2.3.1 The Company's liability arising out of mistakes, interruptions, omissions, delays, errors, or defects in the transmission occurring in the course of furnishing service of facilities, and not caused by the negligence of its employees or its agents, in o events shall exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period during which the aforementioned faults in transmissions occur, unless ordered y the commission.
- 2.3.2 The Company shall be indemnified and held harmless by the customer against:
  - (A) Claims for libel, slander, or infringement of copyright arising out of the material, data, information, or other content transmitted over the Company's facilities.
  - (B) All other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with any service or facility provided by the Company.

### 2.4 Interruption of Service

- 2.4.1 Credit allowance for the interruption of service which is not due to the Company's testing or adjusting, negligence of the customer, or due to the failure of channels or equipment provided by the customer, are subject to the general liability provisions set forth in Subsection 2.3.1. It shall be the customer's obligation to notify the Company immediately of any service interruption for which a credit allowance is desired. Before giving such notice, the Customer shall ascertain that the trouble is not being caused by any action or omission by the customer within his control, or equipment, if any, furnished by the customer and connected to the Company's facilties. No refund or credit will be made for the time that the Company stands ready to repair the service and the subscriber does not provide access to the Company for such restoration work.
- 2.4.2 No credit shall be allowed for an interruption of more than twenty-four hours as follows

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 $Credit = A/720 \times C$ 

"A" - outage time in hours

"B" - each month is considered to have 720 hours

"C" total monthly charge for affected facility

### SECTION 2 - RULES AND REGULATIONS continued

# 2.5 <u>Disconnection of Service by Carrier</u>

The Company, upon 5 working days written notice to the customer, may discontinue service or cancel an application for services without incurring any liability for any of the following reasons:

- 2.5.1 Non-payments of any sum due date to carrier for regulated service for more than thirty days beyond the date of rendition of the bill for such services.
- 2.5.2 A violation of any regulations governing the service under this tariff.
- 2.5.3 A violation of any law, rule, or regulation of any government authority having jurisdiction over such services.
- 2.5.4 Services may be disconnected without notice for tampering with company equipment, for interfering with the service to other customers, for fraud, or in the event of a hazardous condition.

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# **SECTION 2 – RULES AND REGULATIONS CONTINUED**

# 2.6 Deposits

The Company does not require a deposit from the customer.

# 2.7 Advance Payments.

For customers whom the Company feels an advance payment is necessary, the Company reserves the right to collect an amount not to exceed one 91) month's estimated charges as an advance payment for service. This will be applied against the next month's charges and if necessary a new advance payment will be collected for the next month.

### 2.8 Taxes

All states and local taxes are listed on customer bills as separate line items and are not included in the quoted rates.

# 2.9 Billing of Calls

All charges due by the subscriber are payable at any agency duly authorized to receive such payments. Any objection to billed charges should be promptly reported to the Company. Adjustments to customers' bills shall be made to the extent that records are available and/or circumstances exist which reasonably indicates that such charges are not in accordance with approved rates or that an adjustment may otherwise be appropriate.

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# **SECTION 3 – DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE**

# 3.1 Timing of Calls

# 3.1.1 When Billing Charges Begin and End For Phone Calls

The customer's long distance usage charge is based on the actual usage of the Company's network. Usage begins when the called party picks up the receiver. When the called party picks up is determined by hardware answer supervision in which the local telephone company sends signal to the switch or the software utilized audio tone detection. When software answer supervision is employed, up to 60 seconds of ringing is allowedbefore it is billed as usage of the network. A call is terminated when the calling or called party hangs up.

# 3.1.2 **Billing Increments**

The minimum call duration for billing purposes is 1 minute for a connected call and call beyond 1 minute increments.

### 3.1.3 Per Call Billing Charges

Billing will be rounded up to the nearest penny for each call.

### 3.1.4 Uncompleted Calls

There shall be no charges for uncompleted calls.

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# SECTION 3 – DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE continued

# 3.2 Calculation of Distance

Usage charges for all mileage sensitive products are based on the airlines distance between rate centers associated with the originating and terminating points of the call.

The airline mileage between rate centers is determined by applying the formula below to the vertical and horizontal coordinates associated with the rate centers involved. The Company uses the rate centers that are produced by Bell Communications Research in the NPA-NXX V & H Coordinates Tape and Bell's NECA Tariff No. 4

#### Formula:

The square root of:

$$(V1 - V2)^2 + (H1 - H2)^2$$

# 3.3 Minimum Call Completion Rates

A customer can expect a call completion rate of not less tha 90% during peak use periods for all Features Group D sevices (1+ dialing)

# 3.4 Service Offerings

### 3.4.1 TeleLink Communications Corp Services

TeleLink Communications Corp service is offered to residential and business customers. The service permits direct dialed outbound calling at a single per minute rate. Service is provided from prescribed, dedicated or shared use access lines. Calls are billed in one minute increments. No monthly recurring charges or minimum monthly billing requirements apply.

# 3.4.2 TeleLink Communications Corp 8001/888 (Inbound) LDS

TeleLink Communications Corp 800/888 Long Distance Service is offered to residential and business customers. The service permits inbound 800/888 calling at a single per minute rate. Service is provided from presubscribed, dedicated or shared use access lines. Calls are billed in six second increments, with a six second minimum call duration. A \$10.00 minimum monthly billing requirement applies. Customers whose monthly usage is less than the minimum will be billed the minimum amount.

# 3.4.3 TeleLink Communications Corp Calling card Services

TeleLink Communications Corp calling card service is a calling card service offered to residential and business customers who subscribe to the TeleLink Communications Corp Long Distance Service plan. Customers using the TeleLink Communications Corp calling card the carriers service access the service by dialing a 1-800 number followed by an account identification number and the number being called. This service permits subscribers utilizing the Carrier's calling card to make calls at a single per

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minute rate Calls are billed in a 1 minute increment after the initial minimum period of one minute. There are no nonrecurring or monthly recurring charges.

### **SECTION 3** – DESCRIPTION OF SERVICE continued

### 3.4.4. Operator Services

The Company's operator services are provided to residential and business customers who "presubscribe" to this service for intrastate calling. Operator services include the completion of completion of collect, station-to-station, person-to-person, third party billing and credit card calls with the assistance of a Carrier operator. Each completed operator assisted call consists of two charge elements (except as otherwise indicated herein): (i0 a fixed operator charge, which will be dependent on the type of billing selected (e.g., station-to-station person-to-person); and (ii) a measured usage charge dependent upon the duration, distance and/or time of day of the call.

### 3.4.4.A Operator Dialed Surcharge

This surcharge applies to calls when the customer has the capability of dialing all the digits necessary to complete a call, but elects to dial only the appropriate operator code and requests the operator to dial the called station. The surcharge does not apply to:

- Calls where a customer cannot otherwise dial the call due to defective equipment or trouble on the TeleLink Communications Corp network; and
- Calls in which a Company operator places a call for a calling party who is identified as being handicapped and unable to dial the call because of his/her handicap.

The Operator Dialed Surcharge applies in addition to any other applicable operator charges.

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# **SECTION 4 – Rates**

# 4.1 <u>TeleLink Communications Corp. Long Distance Services</u>

Rate per minute - \$0.10 Plan is billed in full minute increments

# 4.2 TeleLink Communications Corp 800/888 (Inbound) Long Distance Service

Rate per minute - \$0.20.

Plan is billed in six second increments with a six second minimum.

# 4.3 <u>TeleLink Communications Corp Calling Card Services</u>

Rate per minute - \$0.20. Plan is billed in full minute increments International calls rates vary by country and region.

# 4.4 Operator Services

4.4.1 <u>Usage Rates</u>: The appropriate rate found under 4.1 or 4.3 shall apply

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# 4.5 Determining Applicable Rate in Effect

For the initial minute, the rate applicable at the start of chargeable time at the calling station applies. For additional minutes, the rate applicable is that rate which is in effect at the calling station when the additional minute(s) begin. That is, if chargeable time begins during the Day Period, the Day Rate applies to the initial minute and to any additional minutes occurring in that rate period, the rate period applicable at the start of the minute applies to the entire minute.

## 4.6 Payment of Calls

### **Late Payment Charges**

A late payment Charge of 1.5% per month will be assessed on all unpaid balances more than thirty days old.

# Return Check Charges

A return check charge of \$25.00 will be assessed for checks returned for insufficient funds if the face value does not exceed \$50.00 but does not

exceed \$300.00, \$40.00 if the face value exceeds \$300.00 or 5% of the value of the check, which ever is greater.

### 4.7 Restoration of Service

A reconnection fee of \$25.00 per occurrence is charged when service is reestablished for customers who had been disconnected for non-payment

### 4.8 **Special Promotion**

The Company will, from time to time, offer special promotions to its customers waiving certain charges. These promotions will be approved by the FPSC with specific starting and ending dates, and be made part of this tariff.

# 4.9 Special Rates For the Handicapped

### 4.9.1 Telecommunications Relay Service

For intrastate toll calls received from the relay service, the Company will when billing relay calls discount relay service calls by 50 percent off of the otherwise applicable rate for a voice non relay call except that where either the calling or called party indicates that either party is both hearing and visually impaired, the call shall be discounted 60 percent off of the otherwise applicable rate for a voice non relay call. The above discounts apply only to time-sensitive elements of a charge for the call and shall not apply to per call charges such as a credit card surcharge.

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
