



**Subject: Proposed Rate for Master-Metered RV Parks**

Dear Mr. Varella:

We have prepared an analysis of electric system costs as included in the 1996 Electric Rate Study (the "Rate Study") to assist the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority ("FPUA") in developing a proposed rate for master-metered recreational vehicle parks ("RV Parks"). The master-metered RV Park rate is based on the energy usage and capacity demand characteristics and resulting cost allocations for the residential class as set forth in the Rate Study. This class was chosen because the proposed RV Park use is essentially domestic in nature and, therefore, matches the existing residential rate the best from a cost of service standpoint. Although this type of customer is likely to be more seasonal than the average residential customer, residential usage characteristics as set forth in the Rate Study are the best proxy available for the master-metered RV Park rate at this time. It is our understanding that the FPUA wishes to offer this type of customer a flat energy rate. We have also included a modest monthly customer charge of \$30.00 to recover the cost of meter reading, billing and maintenance of meters and customer service installations.

In order to develop the proposed master-metered RV Park rate the "customer-related" costs were removed from total costs allocated to the residential class to determine the net cost of capacity and energy allocated the residential rate. Based on the costs included in the Rate Study, the derivation of the proposed master-metered RV Park energy charge is set forth on the next page.

Based on the foregoing analysis the proposed master-metered RV Park rate is as follows:

Monthly Customer Charge - \$30.00  
 Energy Charge for All energy Usage - \$0.08442 per kWh

It should also be noted that the Authority's current power cost adjustment base of \$0.049522 and the resulting power cost adjustments that are derived from comparing actual power costs to this base amount should also be applicable to the newly proposed rate.

**RESOLUTION NO. UA 2004-12**

**A RESOLUTION RESTATING THE SCHEDULE OF SERVICE CHARGES CONTAINED IN RESOLUTION NO. UA 2004-06; FOR THE FACILITIES AND SERVICES FURNISHED BY FORT PIERCE UTILITIES AUTHORITY, FORT PIERCE, FLORIDA, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF FORT PIERCE, FLORIDA, ARTICLE XII, SUPERSEDING AND RESCINDING THOSE SERVICE CHARGES SET FORTH IN RESOLUTION NO. UA 2004-06 OF FORT PIERCE UTILITIES AUTHORITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.**

WHEREAS, Fort Pierce Utilities Authority was created and established by the City Commission of the City of Fort Pierce, Florida, through a referendum election held in said City on May 30, 1972, and

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Fort Pierce, Florida, Article XII, grants to said Fort Pierce Utilities Authority the power and duty to fix rates to be charged for gas, electricity, water, wastewater (sanitary sewer), and other utility services sold and services rendered by said Fort Pierce Utilities Authority,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY FORT PIERCE UTILITIES AUTHORITY (UA), FORT PIERCE, FLORIDA:

**SECTION I. INTRODUCTION.** This resolution establishes the Service Charge policy of the UA with the intent of recovering the cost of providing such services while discouraging unnecessary customer requests.

Unless the context otherwise requires, the terms defined in this Resolution shall have the meanings specified in this Section. Terms not otherwise defined in this Section shall have the meanings specified in the resolution entitled General Rules and Regulations Governing the Provision of Utility Service. Overtime Hours means any time other than during a normal work day and/or work week when there is not a regularly scheduled crew working.

**SECTION II. SERVICE CHARGE SCHEDULE**

**A. AUTOMATED METER READING (AMR) METER CONVERSION:** A charge applied to those Customers requesting an AMR meter, or where the UA requires an AMR meter, due to the Customer making the existing Meter inaccessible. The AMR meter allows UA staff to read the Meter from the street as opposed to locating and gaining direct access to the Meter.

**AMR Meter Conversion Charge                      \$90 per meter**

**B. CERTIFIED LETTER NOTIFICATION:** A charge applied to those Customers who have advised the UA in writing of the necessity for Life Sustaining Medical Equipment, and whose delinquent account requires certified letter notification of the disconnection of services.

**Certified Letter Notification Charge                      \$5 per letter**

**C. CONNECTION – NEW UTILITY SERVICE:** A charge for the establishment of Utility Service to the premises where such service did not previously exist. Under normal circumstances, these Service Charge(s) shall be paid in full before the establishment of Utility Service:

The UA may require, or the Applicant may request, due to a non-accessible meter, the installation of an automated meter reading (AMR) meter. In this event, there shall be an additional Connection Charge of \$50, which is the approximate differential cost of the AMR meter.

**D. CUSTOMER CALL OUT (OVERTIME HOURS):** A charge to recover the costs associated with providing call out service to Customers requesting emergency or non-emergency turn on and/or turn off service and the like, and that is intended to discourage unnecessary Overtime Hours requests. Efforts will be made by UA personnel to assist the Customer with resolving turn on and/or turn off problems.

**E. CUT SEAL AND TAMPERING:** See separate resolution.

**F. DISHONORED PAYMENT INSTRUMENT:** A charge that shall be assessed for each Dishonored Payment Instrument. It is based on Florida Statute 68.065, which is subject to change.

- a) Twenty-five dollars, if the face value does not exceed \$50.
- b) Thirty dollars, if the face value is more than \$50 but does not exceed \$300.
- c) The greater of \$40 or 5% of the face value, if the face value is more than \$300.

**G. FIELD RECONNECTION - DELINQUENT ACCOUNT:** A charge to defray the cost of disconnecting and reconnecting Utility Service previously discontinued or ordered discontinued for cause or because of nonpayment of amounts due. This charge is in addition to the Penalty and Late Payment Charges. Under normal circumstances, these Service Charge(s) shall be paid in full before the re-establishment of Utility Service(s).

If a water Customer also receives electric service from the UA at the same Service Address and only one trip by the UA is required to reconnect both the water and electric services, only the electric Field Reconnection Charge shall apply. However, if reconnection of the water and electric services requires two separate trips by the UA, such as an electric reconnect at the pole by an electric crew and a water Meter reconnect by a water crew, then the Customer shall be required to pay the applicable electric Field Reconnection Charge and the applicable water Field Reconnection Charge.

**L. IRRIGATION INSTALLATION:** A charge for the installation of water service that will not enter the UA's wastewater system (for example, irrigation purposes). Under normal circumstances, this Service Charge shall be paid in full before the establishment of Utility Service.

**(1) Existing Water Customer:** Where the Applicant is an existing water Customer of the UA, and where the size of the service is not required to be increased, and where the Applicant desires a separate Meter for water use that does not enter into the UA's wastewater system, the Applicant may request an Irrigation Installation. The charge for this installation will be the appropriate Water Meter Only Installation Charge, Capital Improvement Charge, and Security Deposit.

**(2) New Water Customer:** Where the Applicant is not an existing water Customer of the UA, and where the Applicant desires a Meter for water use that does not enter into the UA's wastewater system, the Applicant may request an Irrigation Installation. The charge for this installation will be the appropriate Water Meter and Service Installation Charge, Capital Improvement Charge, and Security Deposit, except in the case when the irrigation Meter is installed in conjunction with the domestic Meter. In this case, the Water Meter Only Installation Charge shall apply.

**M. LATE PAYMENT:** A charge to defray the cost of dispatching field personnel to disconnect service for nonpayment of amounts due. The Late Payment Charge shall be applied to each account when the past due amount plus the Penalty Charge is not paid before the UA prepares the bill for the month following the delinquent bill month. This charge is in addition to the Penalty Charge.

**N. METER RE-READ:** If a Customer requests a Meter re-read and the Meter is found to have been read properly during the first read, there shall be a Meter Re-Read Charge. If the re-read shows that the first read was incorrect, there will be no charge.

**Meter Re-Read Charge** **\$15**

**O. METER TEST:** If a Customer requests a Meter test more than once during a consecutive twelve-month period and the Meter is determined to be accurate, there shall be a Service Charge for each test after the initial test. Should the Meter prove to be inaccurate, there shall be no Service Charge and the Customer will be rendered a corrected bill. The initial Meter test during any consecutive twelve-month period shall be at no charge to the Customer.

**P. MISSED APPOINTMENT - CUSTOMER CALL OUT (REGULAR HOURS):** A charge to recover the costs associated with providing repeat call out service to Customers requesting a turn on of utilities, and that is intended to discourage multiple trips caused by the Customer not being at the premises at the appointed time. Efforts will be made by UA personnel with resolving turn on problems. This charge will apply when more than two (2) trips are required to provide service during regular hours.

**Q. OUTDOOR SECURITY LIGHTING DISCONNECT:** See Electric Rate Resolution.

**R. PENALTY:** Payment for all accounts or bills for all Utility Services shall be due and payable to the UA by Customers thereof when rendered. After the 20<sup>th</sup> day from the date billed for such accounts, and to the amount due of all such accounts which are not paid before or on the "total amount due date" stated on the bill, a Penalty Charge shall be applied.

- a) Those accounts listed as government exempt under Florida Statutes Chapter 212 are exempt from the penalty charge. Non-governmental accounts leasing or using government-owned buildings or facilities are not exempt from the penalty charge.
- b) Any account, after thorough examination, may also be approved for penalty-exempt status.

**Penalty Charge:            On past due accounts greater than  
\$50, 1.5% of past due amount.**

**S. PROJECT DESIGN AND PERMIT REVIEW FEES:** A charge applied to those private developers submitting project designs and permit applications to the UA for review and approval in connection with the establishment of New Utility Service for water and/or wastewater. This charge shall be paid in full before the UA returns the approved project design(s) and permit application(s) to the developer or to the engineer representing the developer.

The Project Design and Permit Review Fees shall include UA administrative and engineering services such as approval of permits for regulatory or right-of-way agencies, invoice processing, review of water and wastewater utility plans, preparation of Water and Wastewater Supply Agreements, and inspection of construction. For the purpose of calculating this charge, Development shall be defined as any activity requiring a building permit other than a single-family residence. The charge shall be based on a flat fee for each Development, and an adjustment to the flat fee based on the total number of planned water and wastewater Equivalent Residential Connections (ERC's) to compensate for the size of the project.

**T. PUBLIC STREET AND HIGHWAY LIGHTING:** See Electric Rate Resolution.

**U. TEMPORARY SERVICE:** A charge to recover the cost of installing and removing a temporary Meter and associated facilities. Temporary Service is for short-term uses such as construction purposes where a permanent service and Meter are not available.

The providing of Temporary Service to Customers will be at the sole discretion of the UA and subject to the provisions of this section and other applicable rules, regulations, and policies of the UA. Temporary Service shall be available to Customers requesting such service and paying the applicable Service Charge and Security Deposit for said Temporary Service. Customers will not be permitted to periodically switch Temporary Service Meters from one location to another to avoid permanent service at a fixed location.

When water is delivered through a fire hydrant Meter on a temporary basis, the Applicant shall agree that such service may be discontinued by the UA at any time for emergency usage of the fire hydrant without any liability to the UA whatsoever for such discontinuance of supply. The temporary water billing rate will be at the 5/8 x 3/4 inch Meter rate unless, as determined by UA staff, demand and/or usage warrants a different rate.

Temporary Service shall be terminated at the earlier of 1) the end of the special use or construction period, or 2) twelve consecutive months from the date when Temporary Service was initiated. All removal of Meters shall be performed by UA employees; removal by anyone other than UA personnel shall incur charges as established in the UA's Cut Seal and Tampering Resolution.

Z. **WATER INSTALLATION:** A charge for the installation of water service for Customers located both within and outside the City limits. Under normal circumstances, this Service Charge shall be paid in full before the establishment of Utility Service.

(1) **Water Meter and Service Installation:** Where UA personnel install the complete service (service line, Meter, and backflow preventer).

**AA. WATER SERVICE OR METER - CHANGE IN LOCATION OR SIZE:** Customers desiring a change in the location or arrangement of water service lines or the Meter location, whether it involves a change in size or not, must bear all cost of labor, materials, equipment, and overhead necessary to effect the desired change.


Where an increase in the size of the water service line or Meter is required, the Applicant shall bear all costs of labor, materials, equipment, overhead, and Capital Improvement Charges, up to and including the Meter, reduced by an allowance for the existing Meter trade-in value as set forth hereinafter. Meter trade-in values shall be computed on a five-year basis and shall include the cost of the Meter only. No Meter trade-in allowance shall be granted for Meters in service for more than five years. Allowances for Meter trade-in values (all types of water Meters) are:



The amount computed at the above monthly rate as adjusted by the application of the monthly Power Cost Adjustment Clause shall be subject to taxes, assessments, and surcharges imposed by any governmental authority calculated in accordance with the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority's Tax Adjustment Clause which is made a part of this rate schedule.

**INSTALLATION CHARGE:**

There will be no installation charge for standard fixtures placed on an existing standard wood pole located within 100 feet of an existing secondary facility served by overhead lines. The pole and light fixture will remain the property of the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority. Any relocation requested by a customer after installation shall be made at the customer's expense.

In addition to the charges which may be incurred as provided for under "Limitation of Service" herein, the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority will levy a charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each light fixture the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority is requested to disconnect.

**CHARGES FOR SPECIAL POLES:**

If standard, concrete poles are requested by the customer, the customer shall reimburse the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority for the installed cost differential between a standard wood pole and the requested standard concrete pole. Any non-standard pole (i.e., fiberglass, steel, aluminum, etc.) and/or non-standard fixture will be purchased, installed, and maintained by the customer. The FPUA will furnish "energy only" to such non-standard poles/fixtures. The Authority reserves the right to install, at its own expense, standard concrete poles if it determines such installation is in the best interest of the Authority and/or the general public.

**CHARGES FOR UNDERGROUND SERVICE:**

If underground service is requested by the customer, the customer shall reimburse the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority for the total cost differential between a standard overhead configuration and the requested underground service configuration.

**TERMS OF PAYMENT:**

The terms of payment shall be in accordance with the provisions set forth in the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority's Electric Service Standard Provisions.

**RATE SCHEDULE**  
**MASTER-METERED RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKS RATE SCHEDULE**

The Fort Pierce Utilities Authority shall charge and collect for master metered recreational vehicle park electric service on the following bases of availability, application, character of service, monthly rate, minimum charge, power cost adjustment, and tax adjustment.

**AVAILABILITY:**

This schedule is available throughout the entire territory served by and at the option of the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority.

**APPLICATION:**

This schedule is applicable to all electric service to master metered recreational vehicle parks where service is furnished through a single master meter. This schedule is not available to individually metered residences or businesses.

**CHARACTER OF SERVICE:**

Service under this schedule shall be three phase, 60 Hertz, alternating current at the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority's available standard voltages.

**MONTHLY RATE:**

A.	Monthly Customer Charge	\$30.00
B.	Energy Charge for All Energy Usage	\$0.08442 per kWh

**Minimum Charge:**

The monthly minimum charge shall be the "Customer Charge."

**Power Cost Adjustment:**

The amount computed at the above monthly rate shall be adjusted plus or minus by an amount calculated in accordance with the formula specified in the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority's Power Cost Adjustment Clause which is a part of the "Monthly Rate" of this rate schedule.
